Dear Seycove Families,

Tl'iknumut, Bienvenue, and Welcome! Sorry to interrupt the final few days of summer, but I am so pleased to welcome you to the 2025–2026 school year at Seycove. It has been a joy to serve as principal of this incredible school, and I look forward to another year of connection, learning, and growth together. We will continue to send out a **bi-monthly newsletter** with key dates, information, photos, and highlights from the school and parent community. Additional updates will be shared as needed to ensure families have the information they need about events and deadlines. If you are not receiving newsletters or school updates, please contact the Main Office so we can make sure your email information is current.

As well, we ask that you please check the <u>Seycove Website</u> regularly as it is updated daily with important information. On the first day of school, students will receive their schedules, locker information, and other key details. They will also bring home verification forms and information about <u>School Cash Online</u>, which is used for permission forms and payments. We ask that families complete all electronic forms (including Photo Release and Walking Field Trip) as soon as they have access to School Cash Online and return any paper forms to the Main Office as soon as possible.

If students are missing any courses or there are errors in their timetables, please ensure that they contact their grade counsellor ASAP. If there are any course changes required, please have students pick up a course change request form from the Office and return the signed and completed form to the grade appropriate tray. Once the form is received, counsellors will be in touch with students to attempt to make requested changes – and students must attend their scheduled class until changes can be made.

Please note the 'Shape of the Week', pasted below and posted to our website with key times and dates for our first week back at school. Please ensure students come to school prepared to learn with a binder, paper, and pens for their first day of classes. They will receive information about class-specific school supplies from teachers.













Our timetable continues in a **linear model** this year, and the daily block rotation schedule can be found online. Staff Collaboration (Late Start) dates are also included. Please add these dates to your calendar so students are prepared for 9:50am start times on those days.

As in past years, students can attend **Tutorial Time** from 8:30am-9:10am on scheduled mornings. Teachers will post availability outside their classrooms and online. This time is a wonderful opportunity for students to connect directly with their teachers for extra support, and we encourage all students to make use of it.

These words are more than posters on the wall — they are commitments that shape how we learn, how we treat one another, and how we contribute to our school and the world beyond it. Our goal this year is to ensure these values are visible in all that we do: in classrooms, hallways, extracurriculars, and daily interactions. Students will be encouraged to reflect on what these values look like in action, and we will celebrate the many ways they come alive in our community. Families, too, are important partners in this work, and I invite you to talk with your child about how they can live into these values both inside and outside of school.

To our **Graduating Class of 2026** — congratulations on reaching this important milestone. I am honoured to support you in this final chapter of your Seycove journey. Grade 12 is a year filled with memorable occasions, growth, and future planning. From a technology perspective, I'd like to remind all of our families of the Ministry of Education's policy around Personal Digital Devices that was implemented last school year. Our shared goal is to support student well-being, mental health, and learning by fostering a healthier relationship with technology. We ask all students to leave their devices at home or in their locker during the day.

Students with identified educational or medical needs will continue to use devices as outlined in their IEP or LSP. Thank you for supporting this important work at home by reinforcing responsible digital citizenship.















We continue to look to parents, families, and community members to also model, support and educate students on what it means to be responsible digital citizens. We hope that students will continue to engage in the Ministry and School's rules around devices and, now that we are in the second year, be more focused on the WHY so that we can all see the benefits of becoming more digitally aware. If students face hiccups along the way as we shift our thinking and practice, we see these as learning opportunities where school staff can connect with students and families and engage in conversations around the WHY.

Secondary student passwords expire at the start of the school year and need to be changed annually to provide an extra layer of security and help protect students from potential unauthorized access to their accounts. Students will need to reset their password when they first log in to email, Microsoft Teams, OneDrive, NVSD Portal or a school device.

IT staff will be at the school during the first week of September to provide support if requested and school staff can reset students' password if a student can no longer remember their old password.
