



COURSE CHANGES VS. TIMETABLE ADJUSTMENT

Course Change Window: Sept 3rd to September 12th

- Students with errors in their timetable, missing courses, or requests for a CHANGE, must pick up a course change form from Office, complete and return it signed
 - Students must REMAIN in scheduled class UNTIL change is confirmed (attendance)
 - Counsellors will be in touch when they have reviewed completed form
 - Requests are not guaranteed

Course 'DROP' Request Window: Sept. 29th - October 10th

- Students MUST remain in course until any adjustment to courseload is approved by counsellor and admin

NVSD CODE OF CONDUCT

For all members of our community: students, staff, parents, coaches...

NVSD Code of Conduct

North Vancouver School District's Code of Conduct has been established to maintain a safe, caring, accessible, and healthy learning environment.

It is the shared responsibility of students, staff, parents/guardians, and the broader community, to demonstrate positive conduct while attending any school or district related activity, at any location.

All members of the school community are expected to:

- Support learning and attendance.
- Demonstrate safety.
- · Respect property, environment, personal space, and privacy.
- Model courtesy, compassion, and respect.
- Value diversity.
- Treat self and all other members of the school and broader community respectfully.

All members of the school community must refrain from engaging in any in-person or digital communication or participating in behaviour that is considered to be:


- Interfering with the learning and working of others.
- Bullying, harassing, intimidating, retaliating, discriminating or violent.
- Unsafe or illegal; including the possession, use, or distribution of illegal or restricted substances or the
 possession of weapons or replicas.

All members of the school community are expected to:

- Comply with the purpose and spirit of the BC Human Rights Code, including not engaging in
 discriminatory conduct based on Indigenous identity, race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion,
 marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or
 expression, or age of that person or that group or class of persons.
- Wear clothing that does not promote or symbolize illegal substances or activities, hate or discrimination, profanity, pornography, or that incites violence, harassment, or threatens safety.
- Leave personal digital devices at home, in their bag/backpack, and/or in their locker during instructional
 time. Allowances may be made by the staff for instructional purposes, digital literacy, appropriate use
 based on age and developmental stage, accommodations within a student's individualized Education
 Plan. accessibility. medical and health needs. and/or equitable support for learning outcomes.

Every effort will be made to support individuals and to determine the root causes of behaviour. If the safety or educational program of others is compromised, or if there is an ongoing failure to meet the expectations of the Code of Conduct, a range of consequences will follow. Whenever possible, incidents will be resolved by discussion, community service, restorative processes, referral to counselling and/or support services, mediation, and restitution, but may involve loss of privileges, detention, suspension from school, and/or collaboration with community partners. Confidentiality will be maintained; however, school officials may have a responsibility to advise other parties of serious breaches of the Code of Conduct (e.g. school district officials, law enforcement, and/or other agencies, etc.).

PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES YEAR TWO

- During Instructional time, devices are left at home or in your locker


PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICE POLICY Mental Health Matters



- Phones can raise stress & anxiety (alerts, social comparison)
- More screen time = less sleep and more mood swings
- Many people feel calmer when they can unplug


PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICE POLICY Focus and Learning

- Students spend an average of 5.5 hours daily on their phones- this adds up to 25 years over a lifetime.
- 68% feel phone use negatively affects their studies; nearly half struggle with sleep.
- Students distracted by phones score 13–20% lower on exams compared to peers in phone-free settings.
- Being present boosts memory, understanding, and grades.

Engagement

Substances & Substance Use

Transportation

- Walk
- Bike
 - Bring a lock & use the bike racks
- Do not Skateboard
 - Skateboarding is not permitted on school property
- Pick-up / Drop-off
 - Cafeteria (not in front round about)
 - Note the signs
- Drivers Drive responsibly!
 - 15km/hr speed limit





Pedestrian Safety

- Walk on the inside edge of the sidewalk so you are further away from traffic.
- If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic so you can see oncoming vehicles.
- Cross only at intersections or marked crosswalks. Never jay walk.
- Dress to be seen especially at night and on dark/overcast days.
- Make sure you can hear and see oncoming cars. Remove your headphones and your hood when crossing the street.
- Make eye contact with drivers. Keep your head up and look where you're walking. Never assume that drivers see you.
- Always look for signs that a vehicle is about to move (rear lights, exhaust smoke, sound of motor, wheels turning).


