"With the return of warmer weather, we've seen an increase in scooter and bike thefts from school bike racks. These thefts are often crimes of opportunity, and unfortunately, students' bikes and scooters are frequent targets."

Follow these steps to help ensure your property is protected:

- ⇒ Use a high-quality U-lock or heavy-duty lock (not just cable locks as they have been easily and quickly cut).
- Record the serial number, make and model of your bike or scooter, and keep it somewhere safe in case it needs to be reported stolen (a photo is also helpful).

At Seycove, we are committed to fostering an inclusive and supportive school community where all students feel valued and celebrated.

April is Autism Acceptance Month — a time (as is every other month!) to celebrate the incredible diversity of minds in our community and to promote acceptance, inclusion, and understanding of people on the autism spectrum. At Seycove, we recognize that neurodiversity is a vital part of our school community and that every student brings unique strengths, perspectives, and potential.



Did you know that the term "neurodiversity" was coined in the 1990s to highlight natural variations in how people think, learn, and experience the world? Autism is one part of this beautiful spectrum — and people with autism have made important contributions across all areas of life, from science to the arts.

Some notable individuals on the autism spectrum include:

- **Temple Grandin**, a scientist and advocate whose work transformed animal welfare and helped raise awareness about autism.
- **Greta Thunberg**, climate activist, who has spoken proudly about her autism, calling it her "superpower."
- Carly Fleischmann. A Canadian non-verbal autistic woman who became famous for her ability to communicate through a computer. She co-authored the book Carly's Voice and became the first non-verbal talk show host with her online series Speechless with Carly Fleischmann

Autism is not something to "fix" — it's something to understand and embrace. This month, we continue to encourage our Seycove community to learn more, ask questions, and be open to different ways of thinking and communicating.



Together, let's continue to build a school culture where everyone feels seen, valued, and supported — just as they are.

BCIT - Jill of All Trades



Throughout the day, Avery explored a range of trades including plumbing, machinery, sheet metal, ironworking, cabinet making, and collision repair. She even got the chance to step into the role of an aircraft maintenance technician and operate heavy machinery and large vessel simulators.

The event provided a unique opportunity to work with specialized equipment and learn directly from industry professionals. With 12 trades represented, Jill of All Trades offered Avery and her peers valuable exposure to diverse career paths in a supportive and empowering environment.

PLP 11 - Museum & Government Inquiry

PLP 11 learners have been working on a project asking what role do museums and governments play in acknowledging and addressing historical injustices. Last week, they had an exceptional learning experience in Victoria, connecting classroom learning to real-world conversations about the role of institutions and government in the Reconciliation process.

At the Royal BC Museum, learners went behind the scenes to meet staff involved in the complex and ongoing work of presenting accurate and respectful histories of B.C.'s Indigenous communities. Through conversations about the closure and reopening of the Old Town exhibit, learners gained a deeper understand-

ing of the practical—and often complicated—aspects of Reconciliation.





The next day, we explored the Parliament Buildings with MLA Susie Chant as our guide. MLA Chant was a generous host, taking the group beyond public areas and introducing us to several Cabinet members, including the Attorney General and the Ministers of Education, Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation, Housing, and Infrastructure. We visited the Cabinet meeting room inside the Premier's Office, the government caucus meeting room, several ministers' offices, and the headquarters of the Leaislative Protective Service. PLP 11 became the first school group ever to enjoy lunch in the Par-

liamentary Dining Room (rubbing el-

bows with MLAs, Cabinet ministers, and top bureaucrats!).

A major highlight was a special meeting in the Legislature Library with Speaker of the House, Raj Chouhan, and Clerk of the Legislative Assembly, Kate Ryan-Lloyd. Both took time to learn about the students' project work and engage with their questions.

PLP Field Schools are designed to connect learners with experiences they would not have access to on their own. This trip to Victoria did exactly that. Through expert-led discussions and special access to important institutions, learners were able to deepen their understanding of Reconciliation, the inner workings of government, and see potential academic and career paths in action. - Mr. Hughes














