



Counsellor's Corner

Parenting - A Balanced Approach

The new year has often been a time for reflection and making resolutions. This month we will visit the topic of parenting teens to build resiliency. A balanced approach to parenting offers plenty of love and support to teens. Finding a balance between warmth and rules is important for healthy development and the long-term health of teens. Giving young people the freedom to make their own choices is important as well as carefully judging when the situation requires parental involvement. Parents should prioritize open and honest com-



munication, set sensible <u>boundaries</u>, and encourage respectful behavior in their teens. This style has been called lighthouse parenting. Parents serve as a stable force on the shoreline, guiding their children to safety and preparing them to navigate the waves and rough waters on their own.

Resolve to Be a More Balanced Parent | Psychology Today Canada

The lighthouse helps teens learn from mistakes and bounce back, correct problematic behaviors, and sets clear expectations for their effort. Commitment to the process of learning academically, artistically, socially, athletically is key, instead of a focus on the results desired. That balance of love and care with rules and boundaries helps young people learn accountability and consequences and builds their motivation as well as their confidence. It also makes them more open to parental guidance and more likely to make responsible decisions on their own.

Wellness Club - Let's Talk Day





Turtle Island Revitalization

Turtle Island Renewal Project: Honouring the Land & Revitalizing Our Space

Goal: \$2500 raised by March 14th, 2025

At Seycove, located on **séyemeten**, our core values of stewardship and care for the land inspire us to embark on a meaningful project for this school year. Together with students, staff, and community members, we aim to revitalize "Turtle Island" at the front of our school, transforming it into a vibrant and welcoming space for everyone to enjoy.

What is Turtle Island?

Turtle Island is a name for North and Central America used by some Indigenous peoples, rooted in a creation story where a turtle carries the world on its back, symbolizing the interconnectedness of all life and the deep respect for the environment. At Seycove, the roundabout at the school's entrance was designed to represent a turtle, encircled by the quote, "I Carry the World." Over time, however, the space has weathered, plants have become overgrown, and wildlife has left its mark.

Our Vision

We are hoping to raise \$2,500 to restore Turtle Island through painting, planting, and piecing together its original beauty. By Earth Month in April, we hope to breathe new life into this space, honoring its symbolism and making it a source of pride for our school community. We will be consulting with and inviting members of Tsleil-Waututh Nation to help celebrate this piece of land and will be working with the Coast Salish Nursery to provide the plants for us and to support with the connection around the themes of restoration, habitat, reconciliation, and sustainability.

Looking Ahead

Should we exceed our \$2,500 goal, additional funds will be directed to our next initiative: creating an outdoor learning space where an old portable once stood. This future project will include landscaping, design work, and outdoor classroom furniture that connects students to nature, enriching their learning experiences through deeper engagement with our environment.

Revitalizing Turtle Island and reimagining our outdoor spaces allows us to strengthen our connection to the land, foster learning opportunities, and create a welcoming environment that reflects our care for this community, our shared land, and the nature that surrounds us.
