National Ribbon Skirt Day - January 4, 2025

The ribbon skirt symbolizes the identity, traditions, and strength of First Nations women. National Ribbon Skirt Day, inspired by Isabella Kulak, a Grade 5 student from the Cote First Nation in Saskatchewan, is formally recognized each year on January 4th. Ribbon skirts are handmade, traditional garments that are adorned with colourful ribbons sewn along the bottom in rows. For Indigenous Peoples, these skirts represent a direct connection to Mother Earth and hold profound cultural significance. Ribbon skirts are worn to honour the strength, resilience, history, and culture of Indigenous communities across Turtle Island.

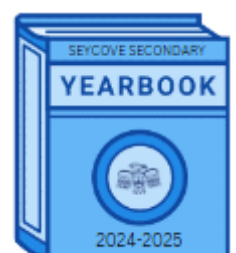

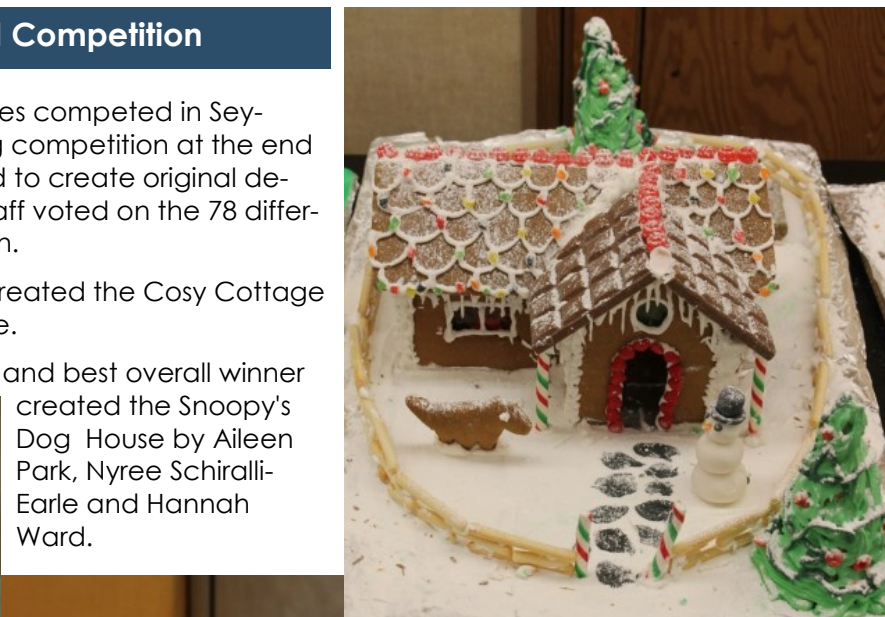

Social Justice - Downtown Eastside

Social Justice 12 students spent a meaningful morning in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside, gaining firsthand insight into the challenges of poverty and homelessness. The day began bright and early at 7 a.m. as students participated in the Christmas Wish Breakfast, where they contributed toys to the annual firefighters' toy drive. Following this, they attended the "Binners' Workshop," an eye-opening session on how some individuals in Vancouver earn a living by collecting redeemable and recyclable materials from dumpsters.

The students then visited Windchimes Shelter, where they distributed Christmas care packages to some of the city's most vulnerable residents. The field trip concluded with a tour and discussion at Triage Shelter, where students learned about the importance of fostering hope and support for people living on the streets. This impactful experience helped students deepen their understanding of social issues while encouraging empathy and action.

Textiles for Change Donates to Sage House

Seycove's Textiles for Change Club had a busy fall. Senior textiles students Maya, Laura, Maddy, Jaida and Emma (pictured below), lead the club with the mission of helping create items to make life better. This past fall the students chose to sew drawstring bags for [Sage House](#), a local transition house for women and children fleeing domestic abuse. The students not only hand made over 30 bags, they also canvassed businesses and neighbours to help fill the bags with personal care items that would be helpful for the women who come to Sage. Thanks to the generosity of our community, the students were able to fill the bags with items including toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, tooth



floss, lotion, make up wipes, nail care and hair ties. "It's such a good feeling to know we were able to help make a difference with our sewing projects. We were overwhelmed by all the donations to help us with our goal!", says Maddy. As for their next project? "We've been in contact with the SPCA and we will be making some pet toys to help entertain the cats who are sheltered there." The group meets once a week but members often take home projects and work on them outside of school time. The club now has around 10 members who regularly contribute but they are always looking for more creative hands to help.
