

#### A Hive of Reconciliation: Ms. P's BC First Peoples Classes in Action

This semester, Ms. P's BC First Peoples classes have truly become a hive of Reconciliation. Centered around the powerful driving question, "What can I do, even if only in a small way, to be a part of Reconciliation?", students have taken meaningful steps beyond the classroom walls to connect learning with action.

Driven by curiosity, compassion, and a sense of responsibility, students have designed and led a wide range of community-based projects — each one contributing to a more just and equitable society. Whether small or large in scale, every initiative has added a thread to the broader fabric of truth, understanding, and change.

Project highlights include:

- **Fundraising for a local shelter** to support the overrepresented Indigenous homeless population;
- A **decolonized BC puzzle map** highlighting Indigenous territories across the province;
- An Indigenized Quarry Walk guide, educating locals on native plant life and geography through an Indigenous lens;
- A collaborative school mural celebrating local flora and fauna while teaching han'q'amin'am' to the school community;
- **Student-created lesson plans** across a variety of topics and age groups, aimed at deepening awareness of Indigenous culture, history, and perspectives.

And that's just the beginning. Each project reflects our students' dedication to reconciliation as a living, ongoing process — one that begins with learning, grows through action, and flourishes in community.

"We were so touched by everyone's generosity," said Sierra. "When people found out where the money was going, they reached back into their wallets and donated even more."



Seycove's very own, Ryan Earl, was recently honoured with a special plaque—beautifully created by Paxtyn Williams—in recognition of his 35 years of teaching with the North Vancouver School District.

Mr. Earl's teaching journey began in December 1989 with his very first TOC callout—to Seycove! He officially joined the Seycove staff full time in 1991 and has been a cornerstone of the school community ever since, making him the longest-serving staff member at Seycove.

Over the years, Mr. Earl has taught Social Studies, Geography, Law, and Physical Education. When asked about his favourite part of teaching, he fondly recalled the many field trips he's led—especially the 25 camping trips to Black Tusk, a true highlight of his career. One of his most meaningful memories is carrying a student—who used a wheelchair due to cerebral palsy and spastic quadriplegia—up the mountain with a team of staff and students so they could participate fully in the experience.

Always attuned to student needs, Mr. Earl took on the role of International Student Coordinator six years ago, supporting hundreds of students in both their academic journey and their outdoor adventures through Seycove's Outdoor Educa-

tion program. He also founded Seycove's first school hockey team two years ago, which has quickly grown into a vibrant and successful athletic program.

Mr. Earl's passion, leadership, and commitment to building lasting student experiences have left a lasting impact on our school. We are incredibly grateful for his dedication and proud to celebrate this milestone with him.
