

#### **ERASE - Expect Respect and Safe Education**

The ERASE initiative works to build safe, inclusive, and respectful school communities across British Columbia.

It provides resources and tools for students, families, and school staff on topics like bullying, mental-health, online safety, diversity, and substance use. A key feature is the anonymous "**Report It**" tool, enabling students to alert schools about concerns such as bullying or threats without having to identify themselves. ERASE encourages students to speak up and feel supported, and parents to stay connected and involved.

If you ever have concerns or notice something that doesn't feel right at school — for your child or their friends — ERASE offers a safe way to raise the issue and get help.

#### Senior Artist Spotlight - Fien Lauteslager

This week, Grade 11 International Student Fien Lauteslager was nominated by her peers in Block 2 Senior Art as our "Artist of the Week" for her assemblage sculpture Fantasy.

Made from found objects, assemblage is an art form that brings together everyday materials—items often overlooked or discarded—and reimagines them into a unified, expressive artwork.

Fien drew inspiration from her love of reading and the many fantastical worlds it opens up, a theme that also carries through into her self-portrait. It's hard not to miss the visual connection between the dash-like brushwork in her painting style and the expressive strokes of Vincent van Gogh—particularly evident in the reference image she selected of *Cypress Tree* and echoed again in her own self-portrait.

Fien is also known as a friendly and supportive peer in the classroom. Her creativity and her ability to weave her passion for reading into her artwork beautifully express key aspects of her identity.




#### Almost Time to Set Sail! Grad Boat Cruise

Date: Tuesday, December 2, 2025

**Time:** 5:30pm grads must arrive for boarding (Depart at 6pm, Return at 9pm)

Location: 450 Denman Street, Bayshore West Marina (vessel: Pride of Vancouver)

As this is a school sanctioned event, the boat cruise will be chaperoned by school staff and all school policies, Code of Conduct, and school procedures will be in place. Security, provided by Spirit Cruises, will be screening students upon boarding the vessel to ensure that they do not possess nor are they under the influence of drugs or alcohol. If students are under the influence of drugs or alcohol, they will be required to be immediately picked up by a parent or guardian, will face school-based consequences as per our <u>Code of Conduct</u>, and will risk the opportunity to participate in other grad events this year.





## Student Spotlight - Kiki V



Grade 11 student Kiki continues to make waves in the world of Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu, earning an impressive 3rd place finish in the Middleweight (-175.5 lbs Male) division at the Prime BJJ Series 12 Tournament this past weekend. Competing against nine skilled athletes, this was only his third competition, but he's already proving himself as a disciplined and driven martial artist.

Kiki's journey began early. He started martial arts at age 10 and moved into Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu three years ago. What he loves most is blending techniques from different disciplines:

"I like taking knowledge from all the different styles and incorporating them. I don't like to stick with

iust one."

He trains six to seven days a week at Universal MMA and Pacific Top Team, and he credits martial arts with helping him stay focused, healthy, and grounded:

"I'm less reckless. I eat better. I use my time wiser. I even

stopped drinking soda. I have more energy than most of my friends."

Kiki also gives back by teaching younger students at his gym, something he says helps him grow as both an athlete and a mentor.

Even with his podium finish, Kiki's biggest takeaway from the tournament was recognizing what he can improve next time. "There's always more to

learn," he said. His goal for each competition is simple: win first place or at least add one new detail to his techniques.

"I like to know I'm learning and improving every time I compete."

And he won't have to wait long for his next chance, his next tournament is in just 9 days.


Way to go, Kiki! Seycove is cheering you on as you continue to push your limits and chase your goals.
