

### **Parent Teacher Learning Conferences**

Seycove's Parent Teacher Learning Conferences are taking place on Tuesday October 29, 2024. The two session times for the conferences are 2:00 - 4:00 pm and 6:00 - 8:00 pm. Conferences will take place in Seycove classrooms and will last 5 minutes each.

Seycove uses an online appointment-booking system as it allows parents or guardians to select their own appointments and book them online. Please note this is a "first-comefirst-served" system and appointment slots fill up very quickly.

As outlined in the letter sent home on October 16th, the first booking window is now open online until October 23 at 11:55pm. A second booking window will be open October 25-28 at noon. Book your appointments HERE.





Provincial Assessments are scheduled to be written this year during the weeks of November 4 & 5, January 13-15 and April 7-9, 2025. Completing the Grade 10 Graduation Literacy Assessment, Grade 10 Graduation Numeracy Assessment and Grade 12 **Graduation Literacy Assessment** is mandatory for graduation.

The purpose of these assessments is to measure the extent to which students are literate and numerate. Rather than assess specific course curricula, the graduation assessments measure the application of numeracy and literacy skills to realistic situations. These assessments look at a students' ability to apply their knowledge and skills.





### **Post Secondary & Careers**

### Mt. Seymour Ski Apprentice Program

This program is an 8-10 week commitment with 2-hours of on snow training per week, 3 volunteer dates over the Winter holiday period, and one full day volunteer shift on either a Saturday or Sunday for 9 weeks from January to mid-March. It will focus on improving your skiing or riding technique to meet CSIA/PSIC or CASI level 1 standards, along with your teaching and assessment skills to make you a better instructor. Program participants will have the opportunity to achieve their volunteer hours working with our Bear Cub (Age 4-7) programs on the weekends. This will allow program participants to learn from our snow pros in a real lesson environment.

At the end of the program participants have the option of booking into a Level 1 ski or snowboard instructor course. This is now a separate, optional component. More info here: Apprentice Instructor Program | Mt Seymour


