Principal's Message

As we settle into the rhythm of the school year, I am proud to see how our staff and students have embraced our key themes of **Relationships with Ourselves and Others**, **with the Land**, **and with Technology**. These guiding principles are helping to shape a meaningful learning environment for all this year.

Last week, our school community took time to reflect on the importance of **Truth and Reconciliation**. Across classrooms and activities, students and staff engaged in meaningful conversations and learning experiences that centered on the history and ongoing impact of residential schools, as well as the role we each play in reconciliation. This focus continues to be integral to the way we build relationships within our community, honouring Indigenous perspectives and deepening our connection to the land we share.

Our staff has also dedicated much of the early part of this year to fostering strong relationships within the classroom and the broader school community, particularly as we navigate the return to a Linear System. During recent collaborative discussions, we focused on how staff are creating inclusive spaces where every student feels a sense of belonging. We are committed to nurturing these relationships, knowing they are fundamental to building a supportive and thriving school culture.

Additionally, the introduction of the **Personal Digital Device Policy** has been a topic of much reflection and feedback. Many of our staff have noted a positive shift, with students now having more opportunities to connect with one another and be present with their learning, rather than their devices. This change aligns with our goal of ensuring technology enhances our students' connections and experiences and with our focus on the mental health and well-being of our students.

Looking ahead, we are excited to welcome families to our **Parent-Teacher Learning Conferences** later this

month. These conferences will be a valuable opportunity to build relationships, connect, set shared goals, and establish a collaborative vision for your child's learning journey this year. Together, we want to ensure that every student is supported and challenged in ways that help them grow both academically and personally.

As we move through October, in addition to many other dates and events of significance in October, we will be honouring **World Mental Health Day on October 10th** and as a community, will continue to reflect on how we support the mental health and well-being of our staff, students, and selves.

Thank you for your continued support - and I look forward to seeing many of you at the upcoming conferences on October 29th.


