Cover Story - Protect Your Texts!

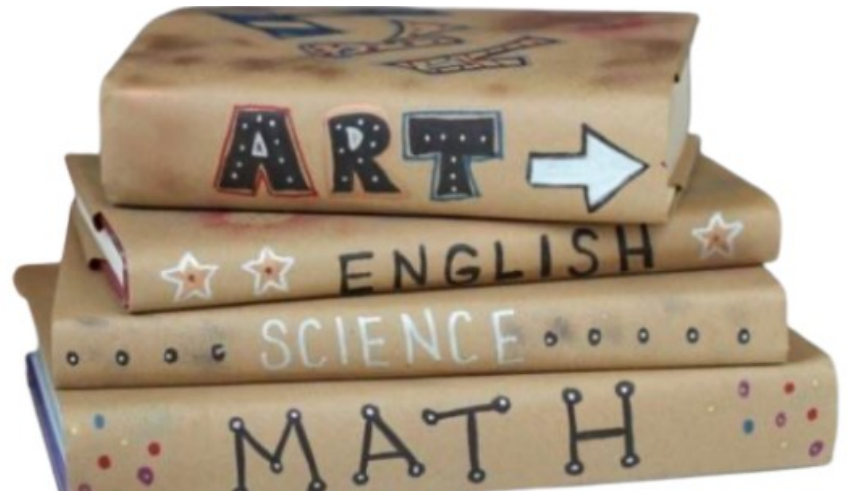

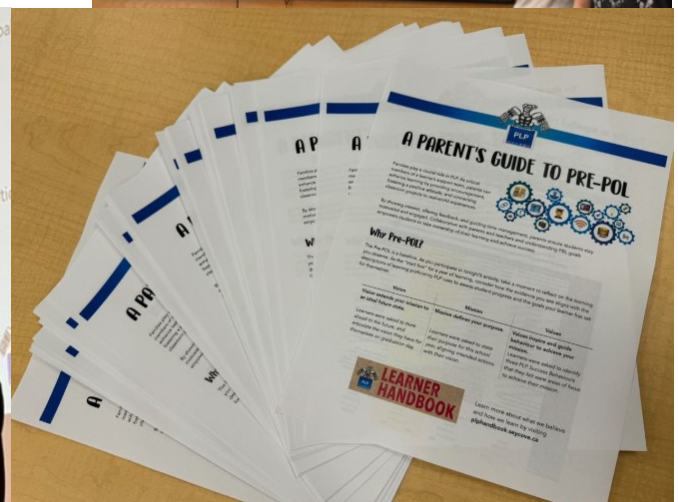


Celebrations of Learning

PLP Pre-POL Launches a Purposeful Year Ahead!

Peggy's Precious Rescue - A Story of Kindness, Collaboration & Responsibility

Seycove recently experienced a beautiful story of community and care thanks to the quick thinking and compassion of four of our students, Hannah W., Nyree S. E., Aileen P., and Aurora B. On their walk home from school, they came across an abandoned baby squirrel. Unsure of what to do, the students reached out to local wildlife rescues, carefully followed proper protocol, and ultimately realized the squirrel needed immediate help.

The little one, named Peggy by Eleanor M., was brought to me, where I did my best to care for her. From there, a lovely Seycove parent, Cherri, generously volunteered to drive Peggy all the way to the Critter Care Wildlife Society in Langley, where she could get the professional care she needed.



This act of kindness highlighted exactly what makes Seycove so special: students looking out for vulnerable creatures, and families going out of their way to support one another. It was a wonderful reminder of the care and community spirit that defines our school, and why I love working here so much!

For those unfamiliar, Critter Care Wildlife Society is a volunteer- and donation-driven organization that admits over 3,000 wild animals every year. Their dedicated team works tirelessly to rescue, rehabilitate, and release animals who would otherwise not survive.

From Safari to Sumo: Seycove Student's Global Adventure

Seycove Grade 12 student Belle had the adventure of a lifetime this summer, traveling from Vancouver → Tanzania → back to Vancouver → Japan → home again.

The journey began in Tanzania, where Belle climbed Mount Kilimanjaro with their brother and mom. The family of three was supported by a team of 3 guides and 13 porters for the trek, which took 5.5 days to ascend and 1.5 days to descend. Reaching the summit was challenging, but the accomplishment was unforgettable.

Following the climb, the family embarked on a 10-day safari, where a highlight was spotting a rhinoceros, a rare and thrilling encounter that made the adventure even more memorable.

After a brief return to Vancouver, Belle's travels continued with the Lions Youth Exchange program in Japan, accompanied by fellow student Austin and Seycove Counsellor Ruby. In Japan, they immersed themselves in cultural traditions, from watching swords being made to trying out sumo wrestling. The culinary adventure was a highlight as well, with Belle's favourite discovery being Yakiniiku, a Japanese BBQ where diners cook pieces of



meat and vegetables over a tabletop grill. The group even had the opportunity to meet the mayor, adding a special touch to the trip.

Though Tanzania and Japan were worlds apart, both countries stood out for their hospitality, generosity, and minimalist approach to possessions and consumption. Belle reflected, "We could do with less stuff here in Canada. Less possessions and less consumption. Both the Japanese and Tanzanian people seemed content with less, and we can all learn from that."

These experiences not only sparked a desire

to see more of the world, but also inspired a shift in Belle's future studies from history to world languages and cultures. "I want to learn more about how the rest of the world lives!"

This summer's travels were more than just trips, they were life-changing experiences that left Belle eager to continue exploring the world. ✈

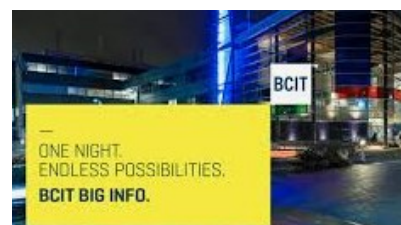

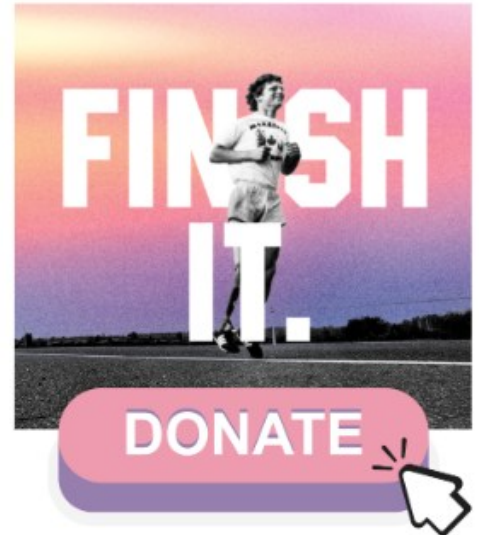
Run for Terry - Finish It.
