As a collective, our staff want to acknowledge how well students have adapted and how staff has been instrumental in ensuring a smooth transition. Their dedication to creating a focused, engaged, and distraction-free learning environment is making a positive difference in the Seycove community.

The slogan we've been using, "Devices off, Learning on", captures the essence of what we are all working toward: a space where students can focus on their education without unnecessary distractions. Your role in reinforcing this message at home is invaluable, and we are grateful for your partnership in helping your child(ren) understand the importance of these guidelines. As you work with your child(ren) to foster healthy digital habits, you may find the following resources helpful to support these conversations:

Please reach out if your child(ren) requires additional support in following these guidelines or if you have any questions. By working together—families, students, and staff—we can create an environment where all students can thrive, both academically and personally.

As we approach Truth and Reconciliation Week (September 23<sup>rd</sup> – September 27<sup>th</sup>) at Seycove, our school is committed to honoring this important time of reflection and learning. This week provides an opportunity for all of us to deepen our understanding of Indigenous history, culture, truth, healing, and the ongoing journey toward reconciliation.

Throughout the week, students will engage in various activities that promote awareness and education around the history of Indigenous Peoples. On Friday, September 27th, we encourage everyone to wear orange to honour the survivors of residential schools and to acknowledge the harm done to and residual trauma affecting Indigenous children and their families.

In addition to our in-school activities, we strongly encourage students to participate in community events focused on Truth and Reconciliation on Monday, September 30<sup>th</sup>, the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. These opportunities allow us to engage beyond the classroom and support the healing process for Indigenous communities.

As a school, we are continuing our commitment to the incorporation of the BC First Peoples Principles of Learning. And with that, are progressing with the themes of Relationships: Relationships with Ourselves and Each Other, Relationships with Technology, and Relationships with the Land and Environment: "Learning ultimately supports the well-being

of the self, the family, the community, the land, the spirits, and the ancestors." With students being away from their phones more so than they have been in the past, we are able to dive into these themes in a meaningful way across classes, in our planning, and through discussion we continue to have.




