- **Provincial Assessments - November 3rd @ 8:30 am**

This examination sitting is only for current 12s who need to write Numeracy 10 and current grade 11s who missed writing Literacy 10. (Affected Families have already been notified in advance.)

A few important points to note about these assessments:

- Current Grade 12s [do need to](#) write the *Numeracy 10* assessment to graduate.
- Current Grade 12s [do not need to](#) write the *Literacy 10* assessment.
- The *Literacy 12* assessment has been postponed until 2021/22.

**Note:** No walk-ins will be allowed, and all students will need to be pre-registered. If you are unsure whether or not you need these assessments, please contact your grade counsellor directly.

- **Take your kids to work day for all grade 9s- November 6th**

Every year on the first Wednesday in November, we encourage Grade 9s to shadow a parent at their place of work. With COVID restrictions in most workplaces this year our teacher librarian, Bryan Hughes, has designed a virtual experience that introduces our grade 9s to the world of work. This activity is designed so that students may continue to attend their scheduled class and complete the activity in their own time. If your child is looking forward to shadowing you at work this year and the necessary covid-friendly arrangements can be made, feel free to let their teacher know and they are welcome to go. Otherwise, teachers will be expecting all grade 9 students in scheduled classes on November 6th, 2020.

- **MS Team meeting for all grade 11 students- Mon Nov 16 @ 8:45am**

Grade 11 students are asked to attend a meeting via their Grade 11 MS Teams at 8:45am on Monday, November 16th, 2020. Attendance for ALL grade 11s is expected, as it will cover essential information about course planning for grade 12.
