Dear Grade 8 Parents and brand new Grade 8 Seyhawks!

Your grade 8 counsellor is Ms. Margie Arnold (<u>marnold@sd44.ca</u>). Part of her role is to help facilitate communication and contact between home and school. If you have any questions or concerns about your

son/daughter, how they are doing, or what may be going on at the school, please feel free to contact her directly.

Ms. Desai (Vice Principal) is the grade 8 administrator this year, and a usual first contact, but as administrators we are both available for questions and concerns any time they arise. We look forward to working with your children in this exciting new stage of their educational journey. We encourage them to be in contact with either of us if they have any questions or concerns throughout the year; our doors are always open.

This year (more than ever before) the role that parents play in their child's education has taken on a whole new significance. In so many ways, the classroom has moved more into the home, and there are new partnerships as parents work together with students and their teachers. A condensed school term means longer classes, which repeat every day for 10 weeks. It will seem that so much more information has to be covered in such a short amount of time. For these reasons and so many more, we encourage you to stay as involved as you can.

While students often express embarrassment at your suggestion that you contact their teachers directly (or worse yet, actually meet with them!) we ask you to <u>please do so</u> if you have any concerns about how your child is doing. Experience tells us that the more that parents are involved in their child's education, the greater their success in their transition from elementary school to high school and on through to graduation.

- Thursday, September 10th First day of student orientation! Grade 8's enter through the front doors of the school at 08:30 am and move to the gym to get their timetable in their cohorts.
