#### **PLP Exhibition**

In the lead up to the Winter Break, Santa and his elves weren't the only people working hard! The PLP learners were working hard to bring to life the amazing and outstanding spectacle of learning that was the PLP Winter Exhibition 2021.

On Wednesday, December 15, 2021, the PLP learners from grades 8 through 12 shared their learning to a great turnout from the community and beyond. Following COVID-19 safety protocols, the audience was given a touring plan to experience learning across a wide subject path.

In the library, the PLP 8 learners brought S.E. Hinton's *The Outsiders* to life from past to present with tableaux vivants depicting worldview in the novel. They also had a display of their Scimatics Tectonic Chances project where tabletop games took us through their learning on tectonic plates.

Not only did the PLP 9 learners put revolutions on trial in the Vortex with carefully crafted performances informed by their work on historical revolutions and *Animal Farm,* they also projected their Scimatics Correlation vs Causation presentations to help draw the audience downstairs.

In the PLP room, the PLP 10 learners examined the role of official apologies in our society as they pitched to the audience memorials for various discriminatory actions in Canada's past history and argued for their commemoration.

And no one can forget the rooms of carefully designed and created conceptual art from the PLP 11 and 12 classes as they showed the historical significance of the atomic bomb across society through to present day.

Although we loved having our outdoor spring exhibition in June, the PLP learners and teaching team all enjoyed a chance to return to a more traditional exhibition in person and with the whole world truly being invited to see their learning in action. #### **Winter Weather**


