- The Graduation Program begins in Grade 10
- Students require a minimum of **80 credits** in grades 10, 11, and 12 to graduate
- 30 hours of volunteer or work experience between grades 10-12
- **52 required credits**
- **28 elective credits**
- A minimum of **16 credits** (4 courses) must be at the Grade 12 level
- **4 credits** must be an Indigenous-focused course
- Required Assessments:
 - Numeracy 10
 - Literacy 10

AP Psychology

AP Psychology follows the same course curriculum as a 100-level university Psychology course.

AP Students will have access to AP resources and practice quizzes and responses to help prepare for the AP exam in May 2027.

Students who receive a 4 or 5 on the exam are eligible to receive Psychology 100 university level course credit.

Students receive AP Psychology course credit on high school transcripts regardless of whether or not they sit the AP exam.

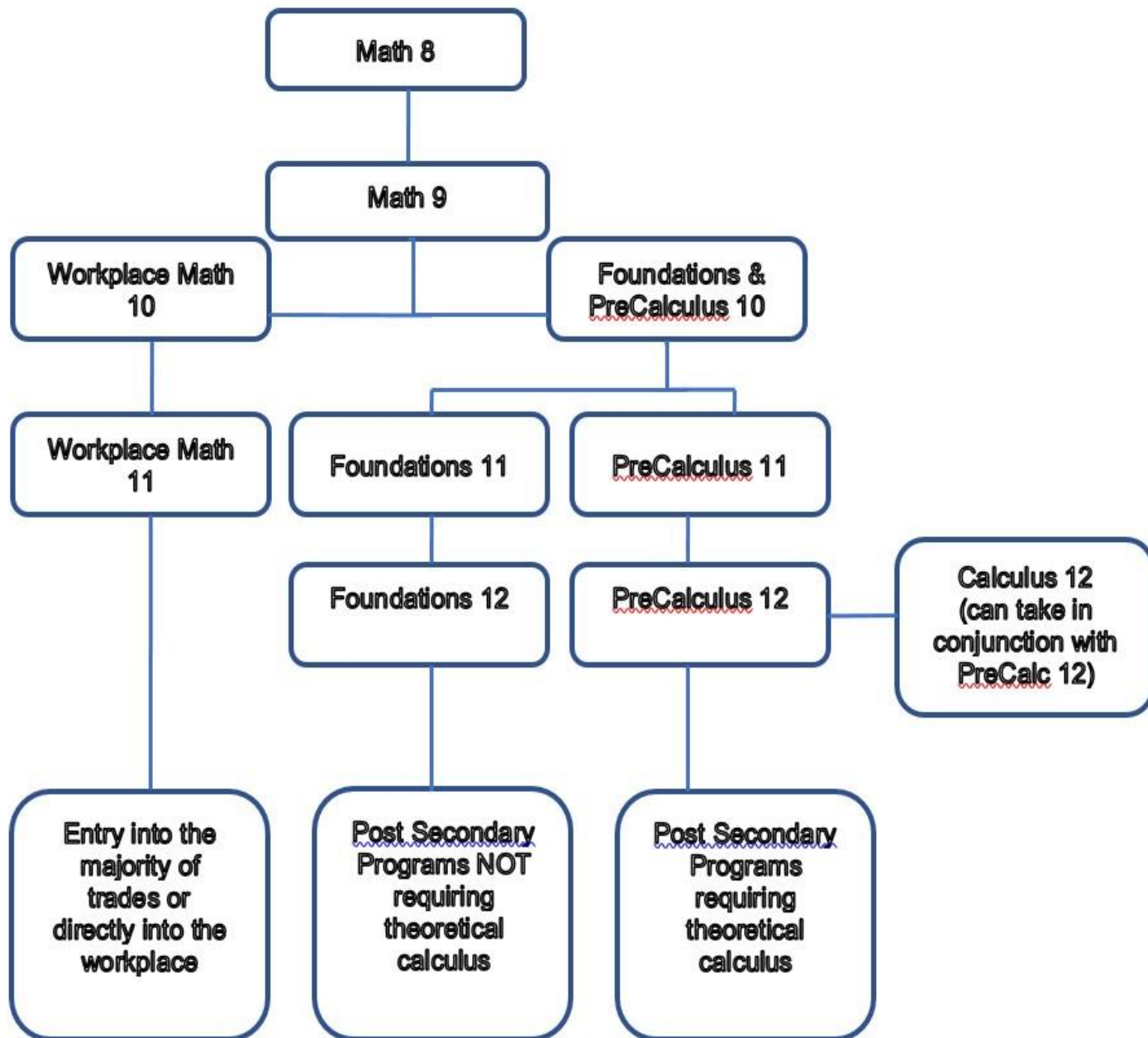

Consideration is given to individual students who, for extenuating circumstances, may need to consider a partial timetable and enroll in fewer courses. **Students must apply to drop courses within the Course Drop windows.** Some considerations are:

- Health concerns that limit ability for full time attendance
- Cross-enrollment with a different school or district program (i.e. YELL, Peak Performance)

Note – requests to focus on academic coursework will not be considered extenuating circumstances

No Dropping Courses Outside of Course Change Window

- Take time to carefully consider the options
- **ALL Students MUST have full courseloads** – and cannot drop classes after September
- Request courses based on current and future interests

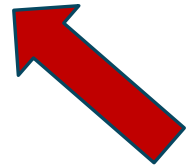

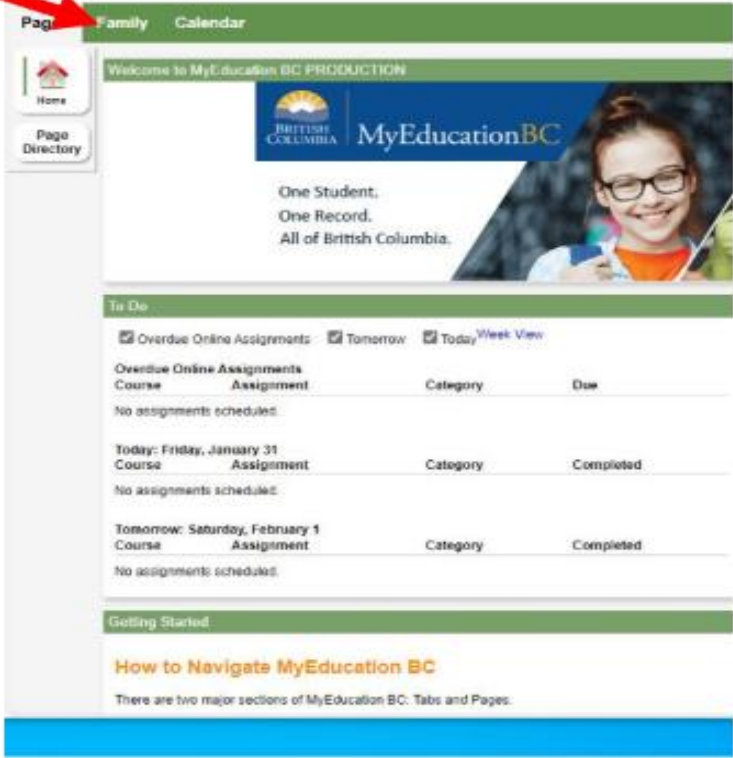

Eligibility

The Peak Performance application process is designed for students in grades 8-12 who meet the following criteria:

- Be a student in good academic standing with consistent attendance at school.
- Minimum of 15 hours per week of supervised, year-round training in one sport or discipline at the provincial and/or national level or at the highest category or level for their specific age group.
- Competition and/or performance at the provincial, or national level in a sport or performing art.

The deadline for priority applications is on or before, May 15th. Late applications will not be accepted after June 1st.

Students will be required to re-apply annually to make a Peak Performance application.

Peak Performance Application Process:

A student who meets the eligibility standards and program criteria should complete the application form with supporting documentation and submit to their grade counsellor by the deadline.

The application will be reviewed by the school committee and applicants will be notified prior to June 30.

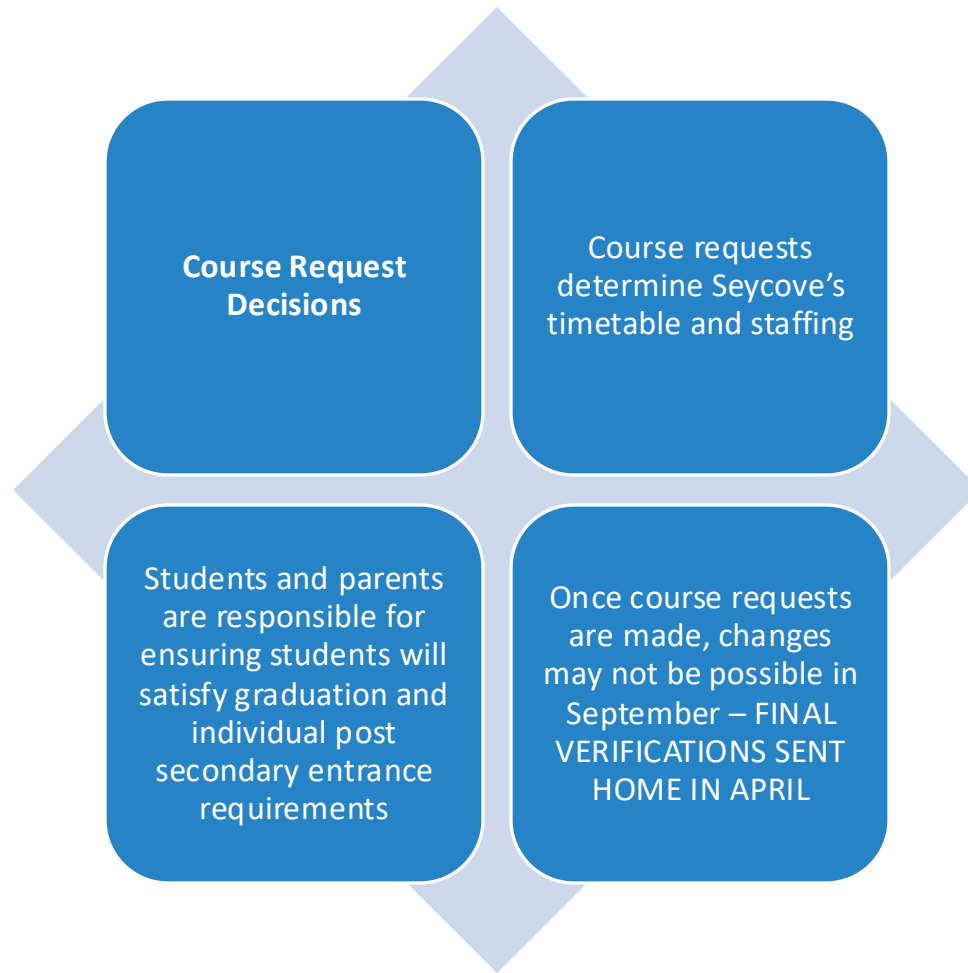
