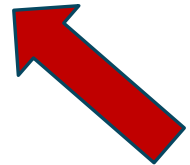



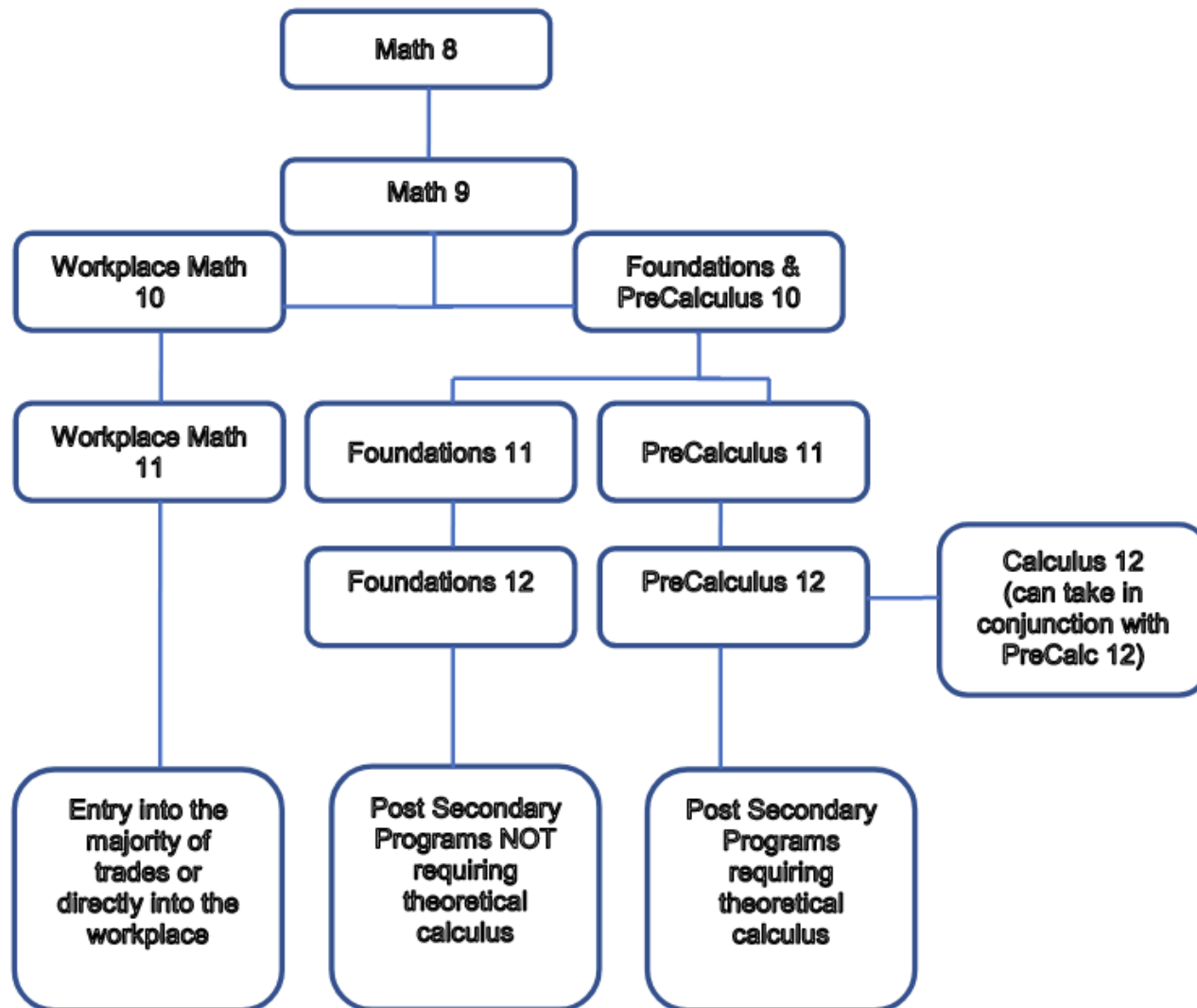

Eligibility

The Peak Performance application process is designed for students in grades 8-12 who meet the following criteria:

- Be a student in good academic standing with consistent attendance at school.
- Minimum of 15 hours per week of supervised, year-round training in one **sport or discipline at the provincial and/or national level** or at the highest category or level for their specific age group.
- Competition and/or performance at the provincial, or national level in a sport or performing art.
