To place a pre-order, select "Send Interim and Final Marks when they become available:" (BC, Alberta, Ontario) • Transcripts with any interim marks will be sent through a one-time data transfer in early-May (if your pre-order was placed before April 23). • Transcripts with final marks will be sent through a one-time data transfer at the end of July (if your pre-order was placed before mid July).
