



Key Note Speaker: Tiana Sharifi is a well known expert in the field of anti-human trafficking and sexual exploitation. With a background in Counselling Psychology, and 10 years of experience directly in this field, she is the founder of the Exploitation Education Institute, where her school based programs, collectively known as Sexual Exploitation Education (SEE) are at the forefront of prevention education on this pressing issue and receive support from the Ministry of Education's ERASE initiative.

Tiana has been called upon to provide consulting services for Indigenous organizations and research institutes, and as a keynote speaker for nation wide conferences. She has educated more than 80,000 students, educators and frontline workers in her lifetime maintaining an approach centering around the root causes that lead to exploitation.

Overview of presentation: Addressing modern day sexual exploitation amongst youth in the North Shore community

- Gain insights into current trends of child and youth sexual exploitation, including online threats and grooming tactics when it comes to peer exploitation, non consensual image sharing, sextortion, online predators, and trafficking.
- Learn how to recognize potential victims of sexual exploitation and the appropriate language and practical strategies for preventing this vulnerability
- -Understand what makes a youth vulnerable or at risk, and what elements of the digital space interact with those vulnerabilities
- Discover strategies for building trust and open communication
- Having a trauma-informed approach to provide support to affected youth
- Discover methods for promoting resiliency and raising awareness among youth
