		<p>Vaping/Marijuana Use Feb 25 – Pam is on a panel with Foundry members, a physician from LGH to discuss marijuana/vaping and how it’s influencing students.</p> <p>Collaborative Inquiry Grant: District offers this to collaborative inquiry groups. A group of 11 teachers from Seycove approached Pam wanting to use a suite of apps – <i>Everyone Can Create</i>. App is free and also has books for teachers and students available through iTunes. The apps allow students to visually display their learning. Current examples: Physics teacher use Garage band app; Music program uses Numbers app. The teachers spent a day with an Apple trainer to go through the apps and learn how to use them.</p> <p>New - District Curriculum Hub: this is a portal for teachers from the district to share their strategies</p> <p>Networking Grant: Seycove, Sherwood Park & Dorothy Lynas – received the grant for a school-based resource study with 9 seats for Seycove. Format is dinner/dialogue and the book being reviewed is Ross Green’s – <i>Lost at School</i>.</p> <p>Question to PAC: School-based Pro-D day is currently scheduled for March 4. Request to change Pro-D from March 4 to March 1 to ensure that all teachers are available. March 4 is Day 1 and most part time teachers are off. Added benefit is that the Seycove Auction volunteers can come in earlier to set-up for auction on that Friday as students will not be in attendance. <i>Motion: Change Pro-D from Monday March 4 to Friday March 1. Award Background

Award Criteria

The awards honours a well-rounded student who is involved and interested in many things and has an understanding of the importance of parent involvement in education. The recipient will receive an award in the amount \$1000.

The award will be presented during the Annual General Meeting May 4-5, 2019.
