IMPORTANT NOTICE

Dear Owner/Occupant:

Re: WATERMAIN PROJECT: Strathcona Rd.- between Harris Ave. and Deep Cove Rd.

During the period November 20th - 2020 to January 29th - 2021 we will be carrying out a District watermain project in your area. The project will involve installing new watermain and services.

When excavations are made in the boulevard and driveways, grass will be removed and re-seeded and driveways restored at the end of the project. The District reserves the right to use inconvenience as possible.

Please note there will be no parking allowed on the street of the affected area between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. during the construction stage of the project.

If it becomes necessary to excavate a deep hole or trench and leave it open overnight or on a weekend, fencing, traffic barricades and flashers sufficient to warn vehicular traffic and pedestrians will be place around the site. We cannot, however, make the site completely child-proof and would ask that you please keep small children and pets away from these excavations at all times. Road repaying will commence shortly after construction.

During construction, there may be temporary water interruptions to your water supply. At such times, we will endeavour to leave notices of any planned interruption in service. Please note there may be unforeseen emergency situations where we will be unable to deliver notices regarding a water interruption and ask for your cooperation and patience at these times.





A FRAMEWORK AND RUBRIC

What did you do in school today?

... a multi-year research and development initiative of

- the Canadian Education Association (CEA),
- the Canadian Council on Learning (CCL)
- a number of Canadian school districts.

It was designed to capture, assess and inspire new ideas about enhancing the learning experiences of adolescents in classrooms and schools.

Research and development work is being carried out through CEA's partnership with the Galileo Educational Network and The Learning Bar Inc.

Note: The Learning Bar ("Our School" Surveys) is the institution that we have been collaborating with in our student surveys for the past 5 years.

• PRINCIPLE 1 - TEACHERS ARE DESIGNERS OF LEARNING

Effective teaching practice begins with the thoughtful and intentional design of learning that engages students intellectually and academically.

- PRINCIPLE 2 WORK STUDENTS ARE ASKED TO UNDERTAKE IS WORTH THEIR TIME AND ATTENTION
 It is personally relevant, and deeply connected to the world in which they live.
- PRINCIPLE 3 ASSESSMENT PRACTICES IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND GUIDE TEACHING
- PRINCIPLE 4 TEACHERS FOSTER A VARIETY OF INTERDEPENDENT RELATIONSHIPS that promote learning and create a strong culture around learning.
- PRINCIPLE 5 TEACHERS IMPROVE THEIR PRACTICE IN THE COMPANY OF THEIR PEERS

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PRINCIPLE 3 - ASSESSMENT PRACTICES IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND GUIDE TEACHING

PRINCIPLE 3 - ASSESSMENT PRACTICES IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND GUIDE TEACHING (CONTINUED)

Students are Self-Directed

Students do not have access to assessment criteria to set personal goals; therefore, are unable to participate in goal setting by identifying proof of learning and reflecting on the gap between current achievement and expected achievement.

Students do not have sufficient access to assessment criteria while learning and/or the criteria are so vague that they are of little help. Therefore students have limited opportunities to participate in goal setting by identifying proof of learning and reflecting on the gap between current achievement and expected achievement.

Students have sufficient access to assessment criteria and feedback while learning and therefore are able to:

- i. identify proof of learning,
- ii. identify the gap between current achievement and expected achievement,
- iii. help monitor their own learning as it progresses, and
- iv. help establish learning goals.

Students have access to and revisit assessment criteria throughout the study and receive ongoing, specific feedback from a variety of sources in all aspects of learning and therefore are able to:

- i. produce proof of learning,
- ii. identify the gap between current achievement and expected achievement as well as plans for reducing it,
- iii. monitor and direct their own learning,
- iv. develop effective learning strategies, and
- v. establish important learning goals.
