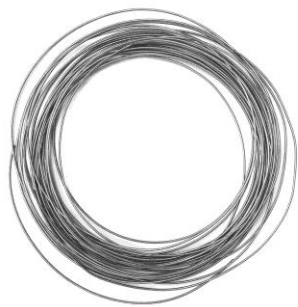

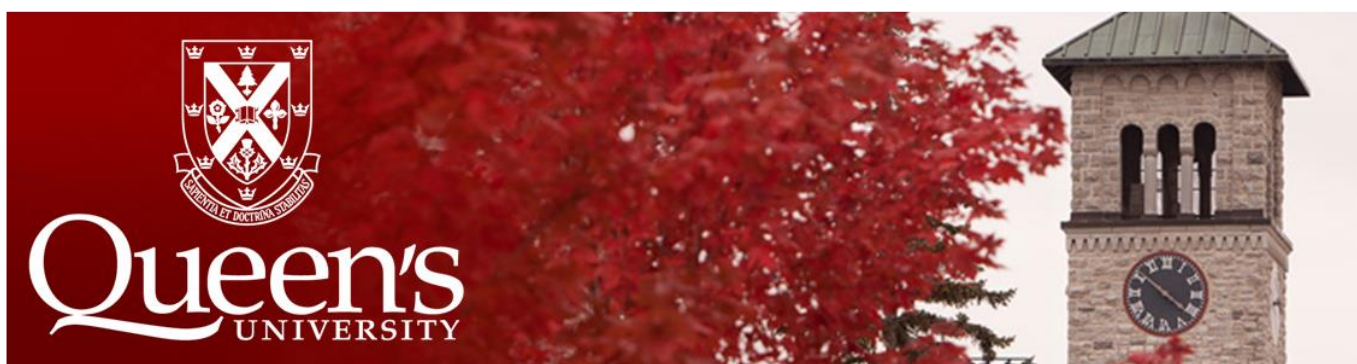

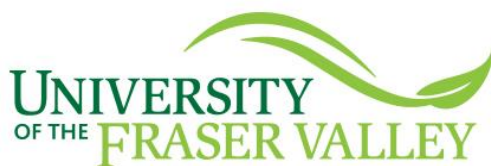

INSTITUTIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Program Changes: Effective September 1, 2016, Faculty of Health Science is discontinuing HSp in Community Rural Health Development and introducing HSp in Health and Aging. Faculty of Arts & Humanities is replacing HSp in French Language and Literature, French Linguistics and Literature and French Language and Linguistics with the HSp in French Studies. The Faculty of Science has introduced an HSp in Biodiversity and Conservation.

In 2016, we introduced the Western Integrated Science program (WISc). This program is designed to provide select students with the diverse science education necessary to address the interdisciplinary scope of today's major scientific challenges (e.g., climate change, world hunger, alternative energy). WISc combines unique Integrated Science courses with traditional discipline-specific courses. Students who complete the WISc Program will graduate with an "Honors Bachelor of Science in Integrated Science with (one of 8 specific disciplines).

Out of Province Financial Assistance: Out of Province admission bursary is available for students eligible for provincial or federal funding. Guaranteed minimum \$1,000.

New Facilities: The new Faculty of Information & Media Studies/Nursing building is slated to open January 2017 at the corner of Lambton and Huron drives, next to the Arthur and Sonia Labatt Health Sciences Building.

Our Chemistry building is undergoing a modernization of the instruction and research laboratories.

Engineering will commence construction on a new 100,000-square-foot building this fall, connecting to the Spencer Engineering Building and Boundary Layer Wind Tunnel Laboratory (BLWTL), along Western Road.

Western Interdisciplinary Research Building is now in Phase 1 of construction set to open in late 2017/early 2018. The phase one building will house dry laboratories, teaching and research space, classrooms, public amenities and a public plaza. The finished portion of the building brings together faculty, staff and students from across the campus to consolidate two major groups – Research Cluster for Cognitive Neuroscience, Rotman Institute of Philosophy and general university classroom space.
