Secondary School Transition

About Secondary School Transition

Summer Learning Secondary School Transition is designed to provide a boost for students who have just completed Grade 7 and may be tentative or nervous about the transition to high school in September.

Secondary School Transition is suitable for students who may need advanced and increased orientation into the high school setting and want to develop skills around the Core Competencies in order to support greater success in grade 8 and beyond. Skill acquisition is embedded within the experiential nature of the course. Students work in a variety of environments and with different tools, in order to gain confidence and familiarity with the high school transition.

This course is suitable for students who will be entering Grade 8 at a mainstream secondary school program in September (as opposed to an IB or French immersion program).

Schedule & Location

All Transition classes are scheduled at Carson Graham Secondary School, 2145 Jones Avenue, North Vancouver, BC.

- Classes begin on Wednesday, July 3 and conclude on Thursday, July 25, 2019.
- Classes run from 8:30 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. daily.
- Attendance is mandatory.

Grade 7/8 Transition Parent Information

The purpose of Grade 7/8 transition is to provide grade 7 students with a variety of experiences to connect them to their secondary school before they begin grade 8. This connection focuses on the development of plans to support the course selection process, and determine any additional supports that may be required for individual students. Additional supports may address both a cademic and social/emotional needs. More importantly, transition supports every elementary student to feel a sense of welcome, belonging and excitement about entering secondary school.

What is Transition?

The Transition process begins in the fall of Grade 7 and continues into the fall of Grade 8. Many processes and activities occur during the transition time frame. Activities may include visits to secondary schools, social events, tours, grade 7 partnerships with older students, and grade 7 sporting events hosted at the secondary school. Central to the transition process is articulation.

What is Articulation?

Articulation is the process which occurs each spring, whereby elementary and secondary administrative and teaching teams discuss the transition of individual students from grade 7 to grade 8. Consideration is given to additional supports required at secondary school.

What Can Parents Expect During the Grade 7/8 Transition Process?

Ongoing Connection Activities:

Each secondary school provides different opportunitites for Grade 7 students to connect with their secondary school. These opportunities (social events, partnerships etc.) may begin in the late fall of the grade 7 year and continue until June. Your elementary school will inform you of upcoming transition events specific to your secondary school.

Enhanced Programs and Grade 7/8 Transition Information Night

The official beginning of the transition process for parents begins with the Enhanced Programs and Grade 7/8 Transition Information Night for grade 7s and their parents in January. The purpose of this evening is to provide an overview of the North Vancouver School District's grade 7/8 transition process, as well as our unique academies and programs. This will assist you in making an informed choice about school and program placement.

Grade 7 Parent Information Meeting

Parents of current grade 7s are invited to a course programming information meeting in early January at their secondary school. This meeting will include a guided tour, a programming information presentation and a question and answer period. The purpose of this meeting is to provide general information about the secondary school and more specifically, to discuss with parents course offerings and programs. Information specific to grade 8 and the transition to secondary school will also be presented.

Grade 7 Student Programming Presentation

The grade 8 Counsellor and grade 8 Vice-Principal will be visiting elementary schools to assist students with course programming for their grade 8 year. These visits will take place in February. Course Selection sheets will be handed out at this time and will be due back to your child's grade 7 teacher at the end of February.

Grade 7 Student Guided Tour

Grade 7 students and their teachers will be invited to come for a guided tour and short presentation in early spring. The purpose of this visit is three-fold:

- to familiarize your child with the school and visit classes while in session.
- to help your child gain an understanding of the school's academic and elective areas.
- to build a sense of community and connection to the secondary school.

Grade 7 Articulation Meetings

Articulation meetings will take place in late May. At that time, the transition team of secondary teachers will visit elementary schools to discuss the educational needs of grade 7 students. If necessary, your child's elementary teacher will be sharing any suggested changes or recommendations to your child's program with you. For students who may require additional supports, the Family of Schools Leader will contact families.

September- Grade 8 Parent Teacher Night

In the fall grade 8 parents are invited to their secondary school for a parent evening. The evening will introduce parents to their child's teachers and the allow them to experience a grade 8 timetable.

Specific dates and details for each of the above events will be communicated to you by your student's elementary school.

If you require any additional information please contact your elementary principal or grade 7 teacher directly.
