
RESPECT FOR STUDENT AND ADULT DIVERSITY





INDIGENIZATION OF THE CURRICULUM



On behalf of the Seymour Heights Learning Community, I would like to thank the Coast Salish people, specifically the Squamish Nation and Tsleil Waututh Nation, whose traditional territory North Vancouver School District resides on. We value the opportunity to learn, live and share educational experiences on this traditional territory.

At Seymour Heights, we value the Aboriginal Ways of Knowing and incorporate the First Peoples' Principles of Learning into our teaching practices. We have enjoyed numerous cultural experiences from Henry Schooner, our Aboriginal Support Worker, who has shared traditional Nuxalt songs and dances with all members of our school community. Henry hosts weekly drum circles and every student has had the opportunity to learn from his stories. Thank you Henry!

Our Kindergarten classes learned their numbers in the Squamish language. They also learned to identify plants that are used for healing and medicinal remedies in Indigenous cultures.

We celebrated Orange Shirt Day and participated in a whole school event to help students understand the impacts of Residential Schools in our country. Intermediate students spent valuable time learning about Truth and Reconciliation and how as a country we are trying to go forward with courage.

All staff and students at Seymour Heights learned the traditional Aboriginal game of Slahal, which students use as a peaceful way to problem solve when disputes arise. Slahal can be seen being played throughout many classes. Ask your child to share how the game works!

Earth Day was celebrated outside with a school wide Circle – to bring us all together in our beautiful natural environment – celebrating our connection with the land. All classes made traditional talking sticks to be used in their classrooms during Circle. Check out the North Vancouver School District Blog post sharing our story:
