

There is so much to celebrate in this short month! Black Excellence is celebrated for the whole month of February, February 10th started the 15-day celebration of the Lunar New Year, and then there is Valentine's Day and Family Day!

Black History Month is a great opportunity to celebrate ways in which Black folks have contributed to making Canada a diverse and prosperous country. Much of Black history focuses on traumatic experiences of enslavement and discrimination, so this celebratory month was voted unanimously in our House of Commons in 1995 and continues to gift us opportunities to learn about the perspectives and achievements from Canada's Black communities. Take time to relearn something this month and add BIPOC perspectives to your media intake for the rest of the year too!

Lunar New Year is celebrated on the second new moon after the Winter Solstice. This year marks the year of the dragon in the Chinese Zodiac, attributing strength, ambition and charm (Time) to children born during this year (our grade 6 students were the last dragon babies!). They are destined for success as visionary leaders with energy, independence and determination, but tend to have a lack of willpower (Washington Post). So if you want a baby born in the year of the Dragon, either get on it or wait another twelve years!

As for Valentine's Day, for many of us, this began with scratch and sniff paper stuffed into class-made

envelopes that were taped to the front of our desks. It evolved into single red roses and heartbreak, dipped into occasional boycotting and then evened out into regular family dinners served with heart napkins. Oh no, just me?

Even the history of Valentine's Day is shady! Saint Valentine was a 6th century rebel who was likely a criminal officiant who inspired a 14th century love poem. That poem sparked hundreds of years of writing about Valentine love. From that, elaborate heart-shaped Valentine card were created in the 19th century and today we use perforated cartoon cards that function as an economic pulse after January retail lows (History.com).

Family Day is our newest addition to the February Festivities. I would love to tell you that Family Day was created in 2013 to simply give families more time together, but that seemed suspicious. A few articles explained how time together is also good for the economy: a weekend of canceled activities gives families a chance to spend more time and money on other family events and attractions (<u>Calgary Herald</u>).
