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#### DRESSING FOR THE WEATHER

As we continue to experience adverse weather conditions, kindly ensure your child is equipped with warm clothing for outside and additional clothing for any necessary changes. We will monitor the weather and temperature, but on most occasions students will be outside for the usually scheduled breaks.

#### SNOW PLAN

As we are in the Winter Season, it is important to review our procedures for emergency school closures. In the event of a major snow event, the movement of traffic can become severely hampered. It is likely that:

- 1. There will only be a **single lane plowed** along major feeder routes to the school such as Carnation Street;
- 2. Cul-de sacs will likely **not** be plowed;
- 3. Parking will be almost **non-existent** along feeder routes; and
- 4. There will be a **high degree of anxiety** and **frustration** on the part of drivers when regular driver patterns and access routes are compromised by significant accumulations of snow.

#### 2024-2025 ELEMENTARY BAND INFORMATION

Our school will continue providing the band program for next school year. Registration for the 2024/25 Elementary Band and Strings program opened on Monday, January 15. For more information, please click <u>HERE</u>. There are two registration options and fees for 2024/25:

- 1. Registration between January 15 February 29, 2024 the fee is \$535 and can be paid through a monthly instalment plan that will be in place until September 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 2. Registration between March 11 September 27, 2024 (Late Registration\*) the fee will be \$600. No monthly installment plan is available for this option.

Families can withdraw their child from the program and receive a FULL refund up to June 14, 2024. After this date, a \$75 fee will be charged.
