Course Description:

The English Language Learners course is designed to support students in enhancing their English reading, writing and speaking skills. In this course, students will have opportunities to practice their oral language and listening skills through skits, role-plays, and videos. Students will read a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts, create their own original stories, and practice language required to express themselves in social and academic situations. Students will develop these skills in relation to the three Ministry of Education core competencies: Communication, Thinking and Personal & Social.

Students will reflect on their own learning strategies through exploring the inquiry question of: "How I am growing as a learner?" as well as the theme of "Connections".

Evaluation:

Students who are meeting expectations can...

- use a range of vocabulary with some descriptive words to create sentences and paragraphs and communicate ideas.
- use strategies to decode unfamiliar words and text and make basic connections to the world from text.
- participate in conversations about familiar topics and some academic content.

Students who are not yet meeting expectations can...

- use sentence frames and repetitive vocabulary to communicate written ideas.
- use one-on-one support to decode unfamiliar words and mirror classmate/teacher examples to make basic connections to the world from text
- participate in conversations in pairs or small groups, with support



Students will not receive a letter grade or percentage for this course. Based on completion of assignments and final assessments, students will be assessed as either Meeting/ Not Meeting Expectations.

Celebration of learning:

The 2019 Celebration of Learning is shaped around "Connections".

Our class will explore various topics related to the Connections concept. Examples of sample topics include communication, peace, innovation, and sustainability. Students will have the opportunity to further their understanding of these topics and demonstrate their learning process at the Celebration of Learning.

Each class will be paired with a sister class to connect with during learning activities and the Celebration of Learning. Each student will complete a connections card. This card will be focused on a topic related to our theme of "Connections". This card includes space to write related words, quotes, images and symbols. The completed templates will be posted up in the school alongside other Summer Learning cohorts to facilitate the idea sharing.
