TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION







Art Students Unveil Powerful Installation

Please read the artist statement below, prepared by Art Teacher Ms. Dokhani, to explore the depth of the work.

In Unity We Gather, Mending the Threads of Reconciliation: This multimedia installation features a stark black backdrop with a prominent grid in the foreground, composed of numerous artistically crafted components employing traditional Indigenous crafts such as beading, textile dying, knitting, crocheting and quilling, alongside contemporary techniques like painting and image transfer. Within the installation, there are 94 individual items—either integrated into the grid, hanging, or positioned in the foreground—that symbolize the 94 Calls to Action. The empty fragments—black holes—serve as compelling metaphors for the loss of language, culture, and identity experienced by Indigenous communities as a consequence of systemic colonial violence and residential schooling. Objects hang loosely within the space, functioning as evocative memorials to children who perished while attending residential schools, their memory resonating throughout the work.

This project is a collective and collaborative endeavour involving over 70 senior students, art club members, and art service students, exemplifying the principles of collectivism intrinsic to Indigenous cultural philosophies. The process of acknowledging Indigenous histories, conducting research, and engaging in creative practice constitutes a deliberate act of recuperation—a step toward truth and reconciliation. Through reflection and cultural expression, students demonstrate a shared commitment to understanding, respect, and restorative justice.

The fusion of Indigenous traditional art forms—such as textile dying, knitting, crocheting, beading, and quilling—with contemporary visual practices reflects Indigenous resilience, storytelling, and ongoing innovation, emphasizing a continuity of cultural expression. The installation fosters a dialogue between past and present, highlighting the enduring strength of Indigenous identity and the urgency of truth and reconciliation.

The gaps between the components are powerful visual symbols of the profound loss of cultural knowledge, language, and collective identity endured by Indigenous peoples. These fractures embody the lasting trauma inflicted by colonial policies and residential schools, confronting viewers with tangible evidence of systemic injustices. Recognizing these voids invites a critical engagement with painful truths, fostering somber acknowledgment of the ongoing impacts of marginalization. In this way, the installation advocates for a healing process rooted in honest dialogue, respect, and sustained effort toward collective reconciliation.




Get Involved!
