Dear Sutherland Families,

With the slide into darker days and rainy weather, it is timely to remind the school community about keeping safety top of mind. Please be mindful of driving within the posted speed limits in school zones. Hallowe'en this evening will bring children of all ages into the streets to trick-or-treat, and we want to ensure that all our students arrive home safely from an evening of fun with friends and family.

Halloween is sometimes celebrated by families using fireworks in a responsible manner within the borders of the District of North Vancouver. A reminder that in the City of North Vancouver, where Sutherland is situated, that the use of both firecrackers and fireworks is prohibited under City Bylaw 7677. Fireworks are not permitted on school property, and we appreciate the community's assistance in encouraging responsible behaviour on an evening that has, unfortunately, in some years been marred by litter, vandalism, and even injury. Sutherland is fortunate to have amazing facilities, both inside and outside of the building, and we want to keep them in wonderful condition for many years to come. Halloween is also a day when students are free to participate in festive activities, including wearing costumes. A reminder, however, that weapons of any kind, including replica weapons, are not permitted on school property and should not be a part of any costume. Thanks in advance for everyone's consideration of this.

Thank you to everyone who attended our Parent-Teacher Learning Conferences on October 16th. It was a wonderful opportunity to connect with staff and reflect on our students' learning and achievements through the first six weeks of semester 1. One topic raised in a few of the conferences was family travel plans on the horizon and how that may impact student learning and attendance. Please note that teachers are typically not able to provide individualized student

support because of family arranged travel plans. Whenever possible, we ask families to consider traveling during our scheduled holiday breaks, so as not to adversely impact student learning. Our teaching staff have been working exceptionally hard to support learning in the classroom, both in regularly scheduled classes and during daily tutorial times. Most full-time teachers are available Tuesday to Friday mornings for tutorial time between 8:30am and 9:11am, and by appointment on some Mondays. Part-Time teachers have been asked to communicate individually with their classes any nuances in their tutorial time support being offered.

Semester 1 school feels have now been added to students' <u>School Cash Online</u> accounts. <u>School fees</u> allow for classroom enrichments such as materials, supplies, or equipment for the use of the student in that course, and timely remittance of those fees is appreciated. Any families with questions or concerns about school fees can contact their child's grade administrator.

With so many events and celebrations happening at Sutherland, it's difficult to capture it all. As highlighted in this week's PAC meeting, in the past week alone we've welcomed students from Japan, celebrated Diwali, hosted a Ballet BC performance in our gymnasium, and celebrated the accomplishments of many teams including our senior boys soccer banner season, and senior girls field hockey qualification for provincials. We hope students and families will stay informed and engaged through our newsletter, announcements, and social media, and know that what you see in the pages that follow represents just a glimpse of the many wonderful things happening daily in our school.

As we move through this busy fall season, thank you to all our families for your continued partnership in making Sutherland a caring and connected community. Your ongoing support for our students, staff, and school activities makes a meaningful difference.

Diwali at Sutherland! Thank you to our amazing group of parents led by staff member Penny who brought the festival of lights to our school. The food, henna, music and more was amazing!






