The Explorers program had exciting adventures, including a fencing session at Dynamo Fencing. Students received instruction from Olympic national team fencers and tried their hand at a new skill. ### **MATH CONTESTS**



### **LITERACY WEEK**

In 2019, the Sutherland English Department invited three local post-secondary English instructors to a meeting with a large group of North Vancouver Language and Literature teachers. We wanted to know what more we could do to prepare students for their post-secondary lives. What we learned surprised us. The professors said that despite having good writing and reading comprehension skills, what student did not have was reading stamina. Post-secondary reading is dense, they said, and the students can understand it; but they give up after three pages because they lack the ability to sit and concentrate for an extended period.

Of course, reading stamina and the ability to comprehend difficult text is important for everyone in the adult world regardless of whether they attend post-secondary institutions or not. To that end, Sutherland's Library Learning Commons strives to promote reading within the Sutherland Community through various efforts, including Literacy Weeks. Four times a year, the library encourages everyone to read for pleasure through these special weeks. Each of these weeks allow us to promote books on various themes, such as Canadian mystery novels, Indigenous literature, or stories of resilience. We also encourage teachers to incorporate reading strategies into their instruction because all teacher are teachers of reading.

Our next Literacy Week runs from November 27th to December 1st. Please encourage your student to come by the library to find some reading material—we have more than 9,000 books from which to choose. Furthermore, when you are discussing the benefits of reading with your student, please remind them that daily reading is a wonderful way to increase stamina in a natural and pleasurable way.
