Planning for Graduation and Beyond..

Highschool Graduation

- 80 credits(minimum)
 Grade 10-12
- Second language is not required to graduate
- Any Math 11 will fulfil graduation requirements

<u>Post-Secondary Entrance</u>

- Highschool graduation with institution specific requirements
- Second language 11 required to enter UBC and SFU
- Most universities require the Foundation/Pre-Calculus Math pathway to at least Grade 11
- Some post-secondary programs accept Workplace Math 11

University Admission Requirements

Most BC Universities will look at GPA based on English 12 and 3-5 approved academic courses

- Look at pre-requisites and recommended courses and averages
 Out of Province
 - Usually looking for English 12 and 4 approved courses

- Portfolios and interviews may be required

Student's Responsibilities

- Research
- Ask questions
- Choose courses based on skill level and interest
- Complete course programming form and get signature from parent/guardian
- Log on to MyEd and load courses
- Submit form by March 4, 2024
- Check course verification forms



What Can Parent's /Guardians Do?

- Support your child's exploration of postsecondary options – start early!
- Ask what do you like and what are you good at?
- Look at budgets and finances
- Look at more than just the programs at schools you are researching
- Teach them to be self-advocates
- Connect with your child's counsellor in case you have any concerns or questions
- Sign the course programming form
