Dates: 10 Week Program - TUESDAYS November 14th - January 30th (November 14, 21, 28 / December 5, 12, 19 / January 9, 16, 23, 30)

Times: 3:00pm to 5:00pm

Location: Multi-Purpose Room

Cost: \$375/ student + GST (Originally \$750, Story Institute is offering ULE families a 50% discount - and also donating 1/2 the tuition back to the school)

*Tuition Payment Schedule: 3 equal monthly payments of \$125/month plus GST.

Grades: 4-7 (Beginners welcome!) 25 spots available

NOTE: This program is only available to Grade 4-7 students currently enrolled at Upper Lynn Elementary.
