Student Learning Survey

The survey covers a range of topics, providing a comprehensive picture of the educational experience in B.C. public schools and valuable insight for addressing current needs and trends.

shirts for other students to wear in solidarity and to show the would-be bullies that the person being targeted did not stand alone. Hundreds of students participated, and from there Pink Shirt Day started.

Pink Shirt Day is celebrated every February across Canada to raise awareness about the negative impacts of bullying and to promote anti-bullying initiatives in schools.

Dear Parents and Guardians/Caregivers,

The Student Learning Survey (SLS) has been administered every year in B.C. public schools since 2001. Prior to 2016-17 it was known as the Student Satisfaction Survey. The SLS provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. The SLS is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences through the perspectives of students, parents, guardians/caregivers, and school staff. Schools and districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal-setting, and in providing individual students personalized support. In 2021, the student survey underwent a review to accommodate an updated conceptual framework that align questions with the <u>core competencies</u> of the curriculum and the <u>British Columbia's Policy for</u> <u>Student Success</u>.

We've worked in collaboration with the BC Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils (BCCPAC) to update the parent and guardian/caregiver survey in 2018/19 and make it more useful for parent, guardians/ caregivers, teachers, and schools. Your valued participation is an important contribution to improving the educational experiences of children.

The parent and guardian/caregiver survey is now available online at www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm and is available in 18 different languages. The survey will be available until Friday, May 3rd, and will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Your responses are voluntary and anonymous, and your child will not be identified as a result of your participation in the survey. Any personal or identifying information will be deleted before results are stored. Data will be stored and accessible only within Canada.

The results of the parent and guardian/caregiver SLS survey will be available through the Ministry of Education and Child Care website (<u>https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey</u>) in summer 2024.



I hope this email finds you well. I am Qiang Lin, a Ph.D. student researcher at Simon Fraser University, and I am delighted to invite you and your child to participate in a research study aimed at exploring the interactive dynamics between parent, child, and educational tools, particularly in the context of mathematical learning in the home environment.

Study Overview:

This research study entails observing and video-recording interactions as parent-child dyads engage with a specific iPad application and a traditional manipulative learning tool, both focusing on numeracy learning. Your family's participation promises to be instrumental in amplifying our understanding of the nuanced role that emerging technology plays in early childhood mathematical learning in the home environment.

Who is a Fit for This Study?

— A parent/guardian and their child aged between 3-6 years.

— Both parent and child are interested in engaging with numeracy tasks using diverse learning tools, such as an iPad-based application and an abacus.

— Both parent and child would feel comfortable being observed and video-recorded by the researcher during the process in the familiar setting of their own home.

Participation Involves:

— Both the parent and child will engage with a digital application and a traditional learning tool while being observed and video-recorded.

— Two recorded sessions, each lasting 10-20 minutes, to capture the interaction dynamics of the mathematical engagement within the participants' home.

— An optional opportunity to participate in follow-up activities.

Your Privacy is Top Priority.

— Your name and personal details will be kept confidential and used only for this study.

— None of your images, recordings, or other information will be posted on social media.

— After the conclusion of this study, all your data will be safely deleted within a specific period.

By joining this study, both you and your child will have the unique opportunity to engage with innovative learning tools and tasks. This experience has the potential to deepen your understanding of mathematics and enrich the overall learning experience.
