School Supplies / Planner

As we prepare for the 2025-26 school year, Upper Lynn will continue with our school-wide supply model for all students. Instead of families purchasing individual items, we collect a flat fee that is **now reduced from \$80 to \$69 per student**—allowing teachers to buy consistent, high-quality supplies for the classroom. This approach reduces waste, promotes equity, saves families time and money, and supports students in building organizational and executive functioning skills. **Planner payment will also be available at a cost of \$8 per student.** An email with full details about both the supply fee and planner payment will be sent home soon, and payment will be collected before the end of the school year to ensure everything is ready for September.
