Welcome Back Parent Evening

Each session will provide the same information, so please attend whichever works best for your schedule. If a classroom is planning anything different, teachers will communicate those details directly to their families.

Safe Arrival / Student Absences

Medical Alerts and Allergies

If your child has any medical conditions that may need to be addressed at school (allergies, etc.), please contact the office as soon as possible. We will send home the required paperwork. Please ensure required medication, such as an EpiPen, is brought directly to the office.

We are a peanut and nut aware school. Please be mindful of the policy in your child's classroom as we have several students and staff with life threatening allergies to peanuts/nuts.

Fresh Air and Outside Play

At Upper Lynn, like all North Vancouver elementary schools, students spend their recess and lunch breaks outdoors every day, rain or shine. We recognize that the previous week brought extremely poor air quality, and during that time we followed the guidelines set by Vancouver Coastal Health regarding outdoor activity.

In general, research shows that regular outdoor breaks are essential for children's well-being. Fresh air and physical activity give students the chance to recharge, play, and return to class ready to learn. To make sure your child is comfortable and prepared, please ensure they come to school dressed appropriately for the weather. It is very rare for students to remain indoors during breaks, so items such as rain jackets, boots, and other outdoor gear are important.

We also encourage families, especially those with Primary students, to send an extra set of clothing to keep at school. Having a spare outfit on hand is often very helpful after an enthusiastic jump in a puddle or an encounter with a muddy patch.

Personal Digital Devices

Personal Digital Devices (PDD) are not permitted at school! Student PDDs such as cellphones, smart watches, tablets, etc. need to stay in backpacks or at home. Students are not permitted to use PDDs including smart watches for messages or phone calls. This is to promote engagement and safety. If there is an emergency, the office will contact you. As announced at our AGM in June, FreshSchools is coming to Upper Lynn Elementary!



FreshSchools is a platform used by schools to simplify organization and communication between the school, parent advisory council, and parents. Please assign your child(ren) to the correct class (similar to Munchalunch) so you can receive messages from the PAC and not miss out on important information.

Getting Started

Please note that to edit your child's profile, you must be using the desktop version of FreshSchools. You cannot make edits through the mobile app.

- 1. Log in as a parent, and go to your parent profile by clicking on the coloured geometric shape (or profile picture if you've already uploaded one) below the FreshSchools logo on the top left side).
- 2. From the parent profile click on your child's name, it will take you to your child's profile.
- 3. To edit your child profile click on the edit icon on your child's profile.
- 4. Scroll down to Classes and using the drop down menu, select your child's class.
- 5. After making changes, click on the Save button. Repeat steps 2 5 for additional children.

FreshSchools is updating the system for better Android use so an app option may not be available at this time. Please use the desktop version.

Do I have to sign-up?

This is a voluntary tool to sign-up for. The PAC will be using it to share all school-based information, such as upcoming events, fundraisers. The Classroom reps will use this for classroom communications too.

Teachers may prefer to maintain communication about your children / class via email, so reach out to them directly to discuss any classroom related topics.

The goal is to streamline school community information and support parent engagement with this tool. We hope you find it useful.

Is this platform secure?

The FreshSchools platform integrates bank-level security at every level. Data is fully encrypted using 256-Bit SSL encryption. It uses state-of-the-art firewall and back-up technology, and the data resides in high-security access-controlled data centers.
