Parking and Drop-Off Reminders

We've received some feedback from families and our PAC about ongoing concerns with morning and afternoon parking in front of the school. We want to thank everyone who takes extra care to make drop-off and pick-up as safe and smooth as possible.

We understand that mornings can be hectic, especially with wet weather and busy schedules, but we all share the same goal of keeping our children safe and showing respect for one another.

Please remember:

- The Drop-off zone is for quick stops only, no longer than one minute, whether for drop-off or pick-up.
- Do not leave your vehicle unattended in the drop-off area.
- Always drive slowly and remain alert for pedestrians.

We've also requested increased parking enforcement from the District of North Vancouver to help ensure safety and fairness for everyone.

The temporary fencing around the playground has now been removed and the school grounds are fully accessible again. Thank you for your patience as we worked through this.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation and commitment to modeling respect and responsibility for our students. Working together, we can make drop-off and pick-up safer and calmer for everyone. If you are interested in joining our Traffic and Safety, please reach out to the PAC.

Dropping off Late / Picking up Early

If your child will be arriving late or needs to be picked up early, please use the Safe Arrival app and email the office at upperlynn@sd44.ca, along with your child's classroom teacher. Be sure to include the office in all messages, as our office staff coordinate and record student arrivals and departures to ensure everyone's safety. When dropping off late, please sign your child in at the office before they head to class. For early pick-ups, check in at the office so we can notify the classroom and have your child ready to go.

Remembrance Day Ceremony

Our Remembrance Day Ceremony will take place this Friday, November 7th, at 10:50 am in the gym. Classroom teachers have already connected with students and invited volunteers to take part in the assembly. Those participating will meet with Mr. MacLeod for two short rehearsals this week to prepare and review expectations.

We invite all students involved in service organizations such as Sparks, Embers, Cubs, Scouts, Guides, and Air Cadets to wear their uniforms to the ceremony. These students will be part of our Colour Guard and help represent those that supported the war efforts on this important occasion. A reminder email about the Colour Guard will be sent home on Monday.

What: GRIT for Parents, with Alix Dunham **When**: Monday, December 1st, 7-8pm

To raise kids who are stable, resilient and emotionally intelligent, we need to show them how to manage their emotions in a healthy way. In GRIT for Parents we explore the development of kids' brains, the neuroscience of calm, and the concept of self-regulation through co-regulation. This is a fun, lighthearted and interactive workshop.

Alix is a certified mindfulness facilitator and mental health advocate. She comes from 25yrs of teaching young people, and developed the program Grit in 2015 to address the youth anxiety epidemic. Since then, she's grown Grit Workshops throughout Greater Vancouver and leads in-school programming, camps and workshops for kids, youth and adults.

Description: Sports Explorers Development allows athletes to build on their fundamental skills by focusing on sport specific skill development and tactical understanding. Athletes will refine techniques such as passing, dribbling, shooting, and defending. Sports include Pickleball, Ultimate Frisbee, Handball, Soccer, Volleyball, Hockey, Basketball and more!

Coaches introduce key concepts like teamwork, spacing, and communication, encouraging athletes to think critically and make decisions during active gameplay. This program prepares young athletes for higher levels of physical education and organized sport.
