

#### **Ways Parents can Support**


- Know your child's timetable

- Encourage independence and taking on new responsibilities






#### How to be a Successful Student

- Talk with your teachers about your learning and/or health needs (IEP) / absences












## How to be a Successful Student, cont.

## Why is attendance so important?

Does it really matter if a student misses a few days of school?

- Yes, attendance does matter, even if it is only a few days. Research has shown that students who attend less that 90% of the time have greater academic struggles, disengage from school, and are at risk for not graduating.
- Even missing ½ day per week has an impact

## Attendance: Illness and Appointments

- Student is ill:
  - Stay home parents/guardian must report attendance
    - Attendance line: windsor@sd44.ca
- If student gets sick at school:
  - Go to the office and sign out
  - Must call parent/guardian to get permission to leave
