Specific NUMERACY 10 Information for Students

- This is an online assessment with a handwritten component; two questions will require students to show their work on paper response sheets.
- Students should bring pencils (not pens) for the handwritten component. The student response sheets will be scanned for marking and answers must be legible and dark enough to easily read when scanned.
- A scientific calculator is built into the online assessment.

The BC Graduation Program requires all students to sit the following Graduation Assessments as part of their graduation requirements.

- **Grade 12 Graduation Literacy Assessment**
- **Grade 10 Graduation Literacy Assessment**
- **Grade 10 Graduation Numeracy Assessment**

- **Grade 12 Évaluation de littératie de la 12^e année Français langue seconde immersion (For French Immersion students only)**

The purpose of these assessments is to measure the extent to which students are literate and numerate and to provide students with information about their proficiency. Rather than assess specific course curricula, the provincial graduation assessments measure the application of numeracy and literacy skills in realistic situations by requiring students to apply their knowledge and skills and to analyze, reason, and communicate effectively as they examine, interpret, and solve problems. Graduation assessments also emphasize the importance of the context in which students should be able to use their skills (e.g., home, employment, society). *(BC Ministry of Education)*

Students are expected to take the Grade 10 Graduation Assessments in their grade 10 year and the Grade 12 Graduation Assessment(s) in their grade 12 year. Assessment dates are set by the Ministry and are non-negotiable. Students who miss a session will be automatically enrolled in the next one.

Students have 2 hours to write the assessment with an additional hour if needed. Assessments are scored on a proficiency scale. The student's best outcome for each of the Provincial Graduation Assessments will be recorded on their BC Ministry of Education Transcript. Students may request to re-write an assessment by informing the Vice-Principal.
