GRADUATION ASSESSMENTS

The graduation assessments look at students' ability to apply their knowledge and skills and to analyze, reason, and communicate effectively as they examine, interpret, and solve problems. for more information go to:

NUMERACY 10

The <u>Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment</u> is a provincial assessment that assesses student proficiency in numeracy. It is a graduation requirement and students will be taking the assessment on **June 19th** and **20th** (for students needing accommodations).

All grade 10 classes are cancelled on the 19th.

LITERACY-FRENCH 12

Students in French Immersion are required to complete Grade 12 Literacy Assessments as part of the Provincial Graduation Program, including the written component and the oral component of the Évaluation de littératie de la 12e année – Français langue seconde – immersion (LTF12).

The **oral component** will be administered between **June 12th and June 16th (8:30 – 9:15 am)**. Students have been assigned a date and time (they can confirm both with their grade counsellor or their FRAL 12 teacher).

All Immersion students will be completing the written component of the assessment on June 21st (8:45am-11:45am-Library Lab).

LOCKER CLEAN-OUT - Week of June 12-16

- Collect a Locker Inspection Form from your Homeroom Teacher during Tutorial time
- Clean/empty your assigned locker
- Have any staff member sign Part 1 of the Locker Inspection Form

WINDSOR LIBRARY & LEARNING COMMONS NEWS

The Windsor Library & Learning Commons has been 'buzzing' lately – thanks to the Beewatch beehive that is now home to thousands of honeybees that are constructing a thriving bee colony in the structure shown below. All the honeybees in the hive are related to one another and they live in a very well-organized society in which each member has a specific role to play. It has been fascinating to see the hive grow in size, as the (female) workers fly in and out, collecting the pollen and nectar, as well as clean the hive, and feed the queen. The (male) drones are responsible for fertilizing the queen and fathering the new generations of bees. There is only one queen in each hive and her sole role is to produce more bees. A mature queen bee can lay up to 2,000 eggs per day! There has been a lot of interest from students and staff as these social creatures create their home of wax and raise their brood, and many students attempt to find the queen - it's not easy as she is a very busy bee!
