<u>Interested in Baking?</u> Vancouver Community College is offering a Baking and Pastry Arts Foundation Certificate. Program graduates receive the following:

- 24 High School Credits applied to graduation requirements
- 24 Post-Secondary Credits resulting in a Vancouver Community College transcript and a Baking Foundations Certificate
- · Level 1 Apprenticeship Credits
  - · 600 hours technical training and 480 hours work-based training (sponsored by student's school district) towards the completion of Level 1 apprenticeship requirements.

<u>Interested in Carpentry?</u> BCIT has seats available in Carpentry Framing & Forming Joiner Foundation. NVSD will pay your tuition towards high school credits.


Work Experience WEX12A or WEX12B (4 credit courses) is available to anyone 14 years or older. The world of work becomes the classroom. The hours can also be gained using students' paid work. In addition, these hours can be used to fulfil the graduation requirement of 30 hours.

Youth Work in Trades is another program designed for those students who are currently working part-time in a trade, under a certified Journey Person, or who know of someone who might hire them to work in a trade. It is possible for students to earn up to 16 credits while in school. Four credits are assigned for every 120 hours of work completed. These hours are also counted towards the total number of hours needed to become a journeyman in their chose trade. Trades are not what they use to be. A great site to look at is <a href="mailto:Tradestrainingbc.ca">Tradestrainingbc.ca</a> - look for foundation programs.

Youth Train in Trades is also available. The Carpentry Program provides training for Grade 11 and 12 students interested in a career in carpentry and related trades. Based at West Vancouver Secondary, students receive training every second day, while attending Windsor Secondary School for core academic subjects. This intensive program allows students to receive technical training typically done at a post-secondary institution while working toward high school graduation. Each student accepted into the program is registered as a trainee with the Industry Training Authority (ITA).


## PARKING AT WINDSOR
