INDIGENOUS EDUCATION

Wesley Baker-Billy is building a traditional Cedar Strip Canoe. This is the first Indigenous Canoe ever built at Windsor Secondary School. Wesley comes from a family of War Canoe Builders (racing canoes). The knowledge has been passed down for centuries and every canoe comes with a family story. Chief Cedric Billy was taught by his family and then passed that on to Mike Billy Sr. who in turn passed that to his son Mike Billy Jr. who is gifting his knowledge to Wesley and our school. Some of the history and stories of the canoes were lost with Residential Schools. Wesley's cousins Barret Martin and Alvin Martin are renown dugout canoe makers, strip canoe makers, paddle makers, drum makers, and model canoe makers from the Squamish Nation. Mike Billy Jr. says, although there is little talking amongst them, they have an in sync working relationship.





Mike Billy, a multigenerational carver from the Squamish Nation, is teaching Windsor students and staff how to build a traditional racing canoe for the upcoming spring 2025 canoe racing season.



- **2. Lytton Lot:** Parking is for staff and students. If this lot is full, students will need to park off school site.


