### GRADE 12 LITERACY ASSESSMENT

Updated reporting practices also ensures alignment with B.C.'s provincial assessment system. The Reporting Policy views learning as ongoing, rather than signaling learning is done at the end of each term or unit. It maintains high standards for students by focusing on helping all students attain proficiency in their learning. # PARKING AT WINDSOR
