## TAKE OUR KIDS TO WORK DAY (TOKWD)

**TOKTWD** is an annual national program in which Grade 9 students are hosted by parents, relatives, friends, and volunteers at workplaces across the country every November. **This year Take Our Kids to Work Day is Wednesday, November 5th, 2025.** The program supports career development by helping students connect school, the world of work, and their own futures. More than 250,000 students and 75,000 organizations participate every year across Canada in this program. A letter was sent to all grade 9 families with all of the information and resources regarding this careers opportunity. The information is also posted on the grade 9 students MS Team named "2029 Grads"

This is an optional opportunity where parents/guardians are encouraged to arrange a one-day job shadow of a workday for their Grade 9 child. This initiative is valuable for students to begin thinking about careers, to better understand the work world, appreciate the different career options, and to network. The more students understand about the jobs of their parents, relatives and friends, the more informed the decisions about their own future career.

Regular Grade 9 classes will not be running on November 5th so that students can enjoy this opportunity without "missing" anything in class. We will be organizing an alternate grade 9 schedule on this day for students who were unable to organize a job shadow. Families are asked to return the completed consent form to room 203 by Friday October 31.

## LITERACY 12 GRADUATION ASSESSMENT POSTPONED

The BC Ministry of Education and Childcare cancelled the **November session of the Provincial Graduation Assessments (November 3–7)** due to ongoing BCGEU strike action. At Windsor, we had originally planned to students writing the assessment on **November 4 and 5**. To facilitate students writing the assessment, grade 12 classes were to have been cancelled on those days. With this change, **all Grade 12 classes will now run as normally scheduled on those days**.

Please note: the Ministry has confirmed that early post-secondary applications will not be impacted. You'll still be able to write your assessment in the January session and submit your results later. The next opportunity for grade 12 students to write their Literacy 12 Assessment will be in January 2026. We'll finalize our school schedule soon and share those exact dates and plans with you.

## ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Windsor would like to raise the awareness of families around the importance of attendance and its relation to student outcomes. Attendance matters: research has shown that students who attend less than 90% of the time (this is the equivalent to ½ day per week; students who miss several consecutive days are even more at risk) have greater academic struggles, disengage from school, and are at risk for not graduating. It also removes them from social circles and can make it challenging for them to reintegrate back with friends, particularly if they have missed important social bonding situations. Please see the <u>Attendance Matters document</u> which includes some important information for supporting your child's attendance.

## STUDENT SUB-COMMITTEE OPPORTUNITY

The Student Inclusive Education Committee is a sub-committee of the school district's Inclusion Committee and was created in 2022. The sub-committee provides an opportunity for neurodivergent students, students with disabilities, autistic students and students with intellectual disabilities to share their experiences and perspectives.

Participation is open to students in Grades 6-12. All students have the option to attend meetings independently or with the support of a family member, peer or support person. The sub-committee meeting locations and schedule will be determined with the participants.

## HALLOWEEN SAFETY

### RCMP urge caution around fireworks and safety on Halloween night

North Vancouver RCMP is sharing safety tips with the community to ensure everyone has a safe fun filled Halloween.

Halloween night is traditionally a busy night for trick-or-treaters, parents, and first responders. North Vancouver RCMP will have additional resources on shift over the Halloween weekend to help ensure public safety.

Police regularly receive an overwhelming number of noise complaints resulting from the use of fireworks. Fireworks are not permitted in the City of North Vancouver and Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) lands. District of North Vancouver requires a firework permit for anyone interested in selling or purchasing fireworks.

Those caught selling or setting off illegal fireworks can face fines. Misuse of fireworks can also cause personal injury or lead to criminal charges.

"Let the creepy costumes and spooky decorations be the only thing that scares you this Halloween," says Corporal Mansoor Sahak Media Relations Officer for the North Vancouver RCMP. "Take appropriate precautions to ensure that you have a fun and safe Halloween experience."

If you have safety concerns regarding the misuse of fireworks in your neighbourhood, please call our non-emergency line at 604-985-1311. The use of 911 should be reserved for emergencies only. Police will prioritize response to calls with an immediate risk to public safety.

911 should only be used in case of emergencies where an immediate response is required.

### What does constitute an emergency?

- $\cdot$  When someone's life is in danger or there is an immediate threat to person or property
- $\cdot$  When a crime is in progress
- $\cdot$  When a serious crime has just occurred and the suspect may not be far away

## PARKING AT WINDSOR

Parking is limited during the school day. With the need to provide adequate parking for school and district staff, guests, community, and students, we request that everyone adheres to the parking guidelines we have in place.

To park at Windsor students and staff must:

- register their vehicles in the office
- · display decal on their windshield
- park in the correct lot
- adhere to the parking regulations
- 1. Broadview Lot: Parking in the front lot is for school & district staff and visitors only. Students may not park in this lot. Parents, please park in the available visitor spots. Please do not drop off students in the Broadview parking lot as this is a student safety issue
- **2. Lytton Lot:** Parking is for staff and students. Unfortunately, if this lot is full, students will need to park off school site.

We have noted an increase in the number of vehicles parked illegally including in areas clearly marked as no parking. For example, vehicles parked in yellow zones, areas marked for emergency vehicles, and in front of waste disposal bins.

Students who park illegally will have their parking privileges revoked. Additionally, illegally parked vehicles may be towed without warning. While we are reluctant to resort to this, repeated warnings have not been followed. If your vehicle is towed, please contact Payless Auto Towing.

We continue to encourage students to walk or take transit to school.



## FOOD ACCESS FOR STUDENTS

Windsor has had, for a number of years, a food access program available for students in need. This year we increased the visibility and access to food by setting up a hot and cold water station with a microwave on the 300 level. There are a number of breakfast and snack items available. We encourage students to bring a bowl and spoon for some items. We want to make sure that as a community we are looking out for each other and those students who are in need are priority for this program.
