TAKE OUR KIDS TO WORK DAY

This year, Wednesday November 1st, is designated as our district **Take Our Kids to Work Day** for grade 9's.

We encourage all parents/guardians to provide a meaningful and safe work placement for their child and/or encourage students to explore possible networks who can support a job shadow experience. To be clear, **this is NOT** a Windsor school field trip so no staff will be involved in organizing, supervising, nor attending any of the workplaces. Parents/guardians are responsible for all aspects of their child's work placement/shadow including transportation and safety for this initiative.

The day is most successful when students and their parents/guardians find an appropriate work site or person to shadow either through relatives or through family friends. The timing and details of the day are completely up to the parent and the work site/shadowed employee.

The school's role is to be flexible with the day and plan for the students who are unavailable to find a placement or do not wish to take part. If your student does not have a placement, or have arranged for a different day, they are required to be at school. **This should NOT be seen simply as a day off school**.

The Careers Department will be visiting all Grade 9 classes Monday, Oct. 23rd where information and forms will be given to the students. The consent form will need to be returned to the main office, or given to their Period 3 teacher, by Friday Oct 27th, so that the school can plan for the day and mark the correct attendance. 
WINDSOR INTERACT CLUB

Stay tuned for our first event of the year which will be a food drive! Dates and details to come.




CLUB SEWING FOR A CAUSE


When changing your mailing address, please attach a copy of proof of address. An example would be a utility bill, BCID, Drivers Licence, credit card invoice etc.

PARKING AT WINDSOR

Windsor has limited parking for students. Students must park in the lot off of Lytton Street. There are a few spots for students in the far corner of the front parking lot, by the school bus. Students may not park in any other area of the staff lot off of Broadview Drive. In order to park at Windsor students must:

- adhere to the parking regulations
- display decal on their windshield
