6) Principal's Report

- -First round of literacy assessments complete. Request is being made to Ministry have the assessment done outside of class time. Assessment disrupted many classes as all computers needed for the assessment.
- -Course programming underway. All assemblies completed. Course selection forms due February 21.
- -Windsor Family of schools course programming with elementary schools is beginning. If not part of traditional feeder schools all requests for transfers need to go through school district office.
- -New group of international students has arrived at the school, 20 new students will be at Windsor for the next several weeks
- -Grade 11 and 12 students need to keep on top of university requirements as they change constantly.
- -Parent/Teacher interviews next Thursday, February 13

- -February 19: School lock down drill. Students are aware it is a drill and there is conversation about what to do and how to behave. Will last about 10 minutes. Police will be on site to give feedback on how the drill goes.
- -February 25: Pascal, Cayley, Fermat math contests for students in Grades 9-11. See Ms. Martin for details
- -Spring Break: March 14 March 29. School re-opens Monday, March 30.
- -Principal was asked if we have an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) at the school. Yes. It is located by main entrance. Administrators and first aid team are trained on how to use it.
- -School Information sign: Facilities will come out to the school to look at improving lighting, traffic lines, and we will inquire as to where we are allowed to place a sign. Preference is to locate it as close to Mt. Seymour Parkway as possible.
- -Concussion Recognition Committee: working to create a reporting mechanism that can track injuries that happen to students who participate in sports inside and outside of school and monitor students performance and symptoms if they have repeated concussions.

7) Other Business

-Update on Athletic Fees. Postponed until April 6 meeting. Next PAC meeting Monday, April 6. Need to correct school calendar from March 2 to April 6. Karen to contact Tina to have her correct school calendar.
