Provincial Graduation Assessments

- Written at school, time provided, offered several times per year
- To graduate students will write:
 - Literacy Assessment – grade 10
 - Numeracy Assessment – grade 10
 - Literacy Assessment – grade 12
 - French Literacy Assessment for French Immersion 12 students – in addition to the 3 above
- Students who missed it in grade 10 need to speak with their counsellor
- **Assessments will be:**
 - Marked on 4-point proficiency scale
 - Reported separately on transcript
- **Gr. 10 Assessments will be:**
 - Will **NOT** be blended with any school course mark
 - Will **NOT** be used by the Post Secondary schools at this point

Assessment Results: Students must log onto Ministry of Ed. Student Transcript Service. Please see September e-bulletin for instruction



Post Secondary Institution (PSI) Requirements

- Typical Science & Engineering Programs require 2 Grade 12 Sciences PLUS Physics 11 & Chemistry 11
- Typical Humanities / Arts Programs require 4-5 Grade 12 Academic courses (may include Sciences)
- Typical Commerce program requires Pre-Calculus 12 (Calculus 12 highly recommended)
- Each PSI sets their own requirements, and these may change without notice!



Minimum Admissions Requirements

- UBC: 6 (at least 5 academics)
- SFU: 6 (at least 5 academics)
- UVIC: 4 Academics
- CAP U: 3 Academics

Work Experience Class

MWEX 12A and 12B -- Work Experience (4 credits each)

- Open to Grade 10 – 12 students
- Course available inside or outside the timetable
- Pre Placement work plus a maximum 90 hour job placement(s) each
 - Summer placements available as well
- IF student is working, some of those hours can be used towards the course
 - This is dependent on area of interest AND if the employer meets requirements






