# **General Materials** Soft 3 ring binder Pin cushion, pins, seam ripper, needle, and scissors \$2 bobbin rental fee (returned at the end of course if bobbin is returned) Project #1: Gym Bag 1 m (or 2 x 0.5 m) fabriccotton polyester woven 1 spool of thread to match the fabric (100m or more) 4 m of drawstring **Project #2: PJ Shorts** 1 m fabric – cotton polyester woven 2 spools of thread 1 m elastic (non-twist)
