### **Onesie Project:**

- 3.5 4 m of Cotton Flannel or Cotton Knit fabric (150 cm WIDE)
- 2 spools of thread
- **⊠** 0.5 m ribbing

## **Plaid Shirt Project:**

- 3 m of Cotton or cotton blend fabric
- 2 spools of thread
- 12 small buttons

Store locations: Michaels (poor selection). OurSocialFabric is the most affordable place (located at 270-1275 Venables Street, Vancouver), with great selection, but is only open on Thursday 3 pm - 7 pm and Sunday 10 am - 2 pm (it is run by volunteers). Lastly, Fabricland (1678 SE Marine Dr, Vancouver) has a large selection, and great sale section as well, but you need a 25\$ membership to buy most sale items.
Sewing Project requirements: The supplementary fee (paid at the start of the year to the office) allows me to provide students with everything needed for the 5 small projects that we complete in the school year. However, there will be 3 big projects and students need to bring fabric, thread and any other materials required (elastic, buttons, etc.) for them.
