Nation: Tsleil Waututh Nation and Squamish

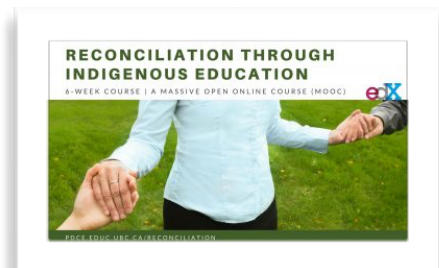


School: Ecole Sherwood Park Elementary
