

Phyllis Webstad created Orange Shirt Day in 2013



"All I ask is that both days be remembered like in posters and media. It's not one or the other, it's both." - Webstad

Why it's on the same day:

- include <u>Orange Shirt Day</u> in the wording of the legislation
- it would always be referenced in literature across the country.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

A focus on Healing

Navigating the wounded landscape Please consider the following:

For Indigenous staff and students, this day is loaded with hurt and trauma.

- Share the truth that is already available rather than asking Indigenous people to share their authentic/personal voice in this area.
- Indigenous people will only share their stories when they choose to.
- This day often reopens the wounds of Indigenous peoples. Lead with a gentle heart in discussions.
- Follow the First Peoples Principles of Learning:
 - Learning involves patience and time.




