• **Kindergarten** maximum **20** students (including K/1 combined classes)

• Primary

- (Grades 1 to 3)
- (Grade 3/4 combined classes)
maximum 22 students
maximum 23 students

• Intermediate (Grades 4 to 7) maximum 29 students

• Secondary (Grades 8 to 12) maximum **30** students

# Remedy



### **Remedy Process**

- Maximum size/composition of classes is established every month
- Spreadsheet tool calculates the Remedy compensation (minutes) for each affected teacher, based upon maximum class size/composition numbers
- Remedy minutes accumulate for each month in which the class exceeds the maximums

### Remedy



### **Remedy Process**

- Teacher selects choice of Remedy, provided as minutes for:
  - Additional preparation time for the teacher
  - Specialist teacher to work with the affected class
  - Co-teacher in the affected classroom
- School Administration creates plan for delivery of Remedy compensation in the school
- Teacher Remedy compensation minutes are monitored, recorded, and displayed by Payroll

### Remedy - Class Size and Composition

#### October Incidences & Total Remedy Compensation

	Number of Classes	Total Remedy Minutes	Total Remedy Days
Elementary	100	41,216.4	141.15
Secondary	432	25,456.9	87.18

- Elementary Classes include those taught by Vice Principals (not eligible for remedy/compensation)
- Secondary Classes include only those currently in session (i.e., does not include Semester 2 or other classes not in place in October)

Minutes of Remedy	Number of Schools
0 - 360	10
360 – 5,600	15
5,600 +	6

- One TTOC day is approximately 300 minutes
- 1.0 fte is approximately 5,600 minutes
